Vehicle Points and Offenses

The courts vehicle policy is set by the Judiciary where they outline all details about all the little details about the policy. This guide will cover the main points that you will come across on a day to day basis.

Court's Vehicle Policy

Dangerous Drive section 2 with Failure to stop - 2 points

Dangerous Drive section 1a (Serious Injury) - 4 points - Only applies to citizens and not locals

Dangerous Drive Section 1 (Death) - 6 points - Only applies to citizens and not locals

Interfering with a pursuit - 3 points

Motor-racing - Section 12 - 3 points

Driving without a licence Section 103 - 10 points

Shooting/deploying weaponry with intent to cause harm or resulting in actual harm from a vehicle - 10 points

Illegal modifications on vehicles - 1 point

Possession with intent to Supply/Supply of Drugs - 2 points

Used in commission of a Defined Secondary Offence - 1.5x

The list of all offenses can also be found on the Vehicle points submission form. The most common offenses you will come across will be for:

- Dangerous Driver with failure to stop.
- Interfering with a pursuit
- Shooting or deploying weaponry with intent to cause harm from a vehicle

The rest of the offenses fall under RPU and you are unlikely to come across them. The use in commission of a secondary serious offense (1.5x) is very complicated to use hence mass gang shootings or bank robberies always reach out to RPU seniors or RCT for assistance.



Ensuring VP points are valid

To ensure the points are valid, you must ensure you have a report of good quality and in line with reporting standards.

CHARGES

- (1x) Road Traffic Act 1988 S2 Dangerous Driving
- (1x) Road Traffic Act 1988 S163(3) Failure to stop for the police

If you have arrested someone and the charges include FTS and DD charges and it was done in a personal vehicle, this car is eligible for 2 points under the vehicle policy.

First thing to ensure is that there is body worn video of the driving offenses occurring, such as BWV of the chase. If no body worn is present, you CANNOT give any points (MG11 will NOT be sufficient).

VEHICLE(S):

BLACK SULTAN CLASSIC - VRM DI03 UCM

Once the evidence link has been added to the report which shows the driving offenses in question, the next step is to ensure that the VEHICLE(S) section on the report is correctly showing the correct vehicle registration marker (VRM) / Number Plate.

There is NO requirement for a suspect to be arrested or even identified for VP points to be added, hence if you chase a vehicle and it drives dangerously and gets away, you can STILL put points on the vehicle.




If there is no suspect arrested or identified the officer must confirm with PNC that the vehicle is NOT marked as stolen. If it is stolen VL points can not be added.

Creating a NO Suspect report

In the case that a vehicle successfully evades police or commits any crimes worthy of vehicle points, an RCT/vehicle Report must be created.

A vehicle report looks as follows:

Use the above template to copy and paste into the PNC and add the relevant details as shown in the example above.




Submitting the points for review

Once the report has been submitted, fill in the following google form:

VEHICLE POINTS SUBMISSION FORM

Once the form has been filled it, it will automatically be sent for an Inspector + to review. Ensure you have added the correct report number to ensure the correct report is reviewed.

If the inspector is happy with the offenses displayed and the evidence he will then add the points on to the vehicle's registration page.

Once the vehicle has reached **20 POINTS** it has then met the criteria to be eligible to be scrapped.



Seizing the vehicle

This part should be left to RCT. If you are at this stage where the vehicle you have gotten points added to, has reached 20 points, fill out the form linked below or notify a RPU SGT+ and they can carry on forwards from there.

For the top officers who are looking to join Traffic/RCT or just curious souls. The rest of the procedure is what is followed by RCT and TRAFFIC.

The rest of the guide is for TRAFFIC OFFICERS.

Once the vehicle points have reached 20, the vehicle must then be seized by police. This can be done one of three ways.

- 1. Apply for a warrant with the Judiciary which will allow an Inspector to pull the car out of whichever parking it is stored at.
- 2. Find the car whilst it is out and about being driven around and seize it from the driver. Once the vehicle has reached 20 points, the police have the authority to seize the car at any place, any time in a public place.
- 3. Car is already in the impound.

When a car has been acquired it <u>MUST</u> be impounded for the impound reason of **Investigation - SOCA**. This is the guideline set by the courts as it ensures that the judiciary has ample time to review scrap requests.

Investigation [SOCA] Serious Organised Crime Act, allows for a investigation to take place, pending a decision to scrap the vehicle.




Scrap request for the vehicle


Once the vehicle has been seized, a request to the Judiciary must be made so that the judges can review the points and then scrap the vehicle.

Submit the seizure request


Step 1: Head to any police computer.



Step 2: Open the police computer using your third eye and the following menu will pop up, where you will click the VIEW POLICE COMPUTER:



Step 3: Once you're in the police computer you will be prompted by a few options such as Vehicle seizure request and the one we will be using; Vehicle Seizure Request.



Step 4: Input the required information. In the additional comments, you will state that the vehicle has 20 points.



Step 5: Once you have filled the information in, you can confirm if the form has been submitted correctly by going back to the police computer and selecting the VEHICLE SEIZURE DATABASE.

Ensure the correct name appears for the vehicle owner and ensure you have selected the correct license plate to be scrapped.

If you have followed all the steps in the guide and all the evidence is in order, a judge will review and accept your scrap request. You will be notified via text if your scrap request was accepted or not. If it was not accepted, the Judge will leave remarks as to why it was denied.
