

Week 1 Exposed on Purpose

Big Idea: God has exposed us so His mission can be visible through us.

Scripture Reading: Philippians 1:12–18

Engaging the Text:

1. What does Paul mean when he says his imprisonment advanced the Gospel?
2. How did Paul's chains create new opportunities for the Gospel?
3. Why does Paul rejoice even when others preach from false motives?

Discussion Questions:

- How do you feel about our church being “exposed”?
- Where have you seen God turn a setback in your life into an opportunity?
- What excites you and what scares you about this new season of exposure?

Application: Write down 5 names of people you will pray for and invite. Share them with the group.

Next Step: Pray for your 5 names daily this week.

Week 2 Seeing the Field

Big Idea: God has placed us exactly where we are for Gospel impact.

Scripture Reading: John 4:27–42

Engaging the Text:

1. Why did Jesus talk with the Samaritan woman when others avoided her?
2. What does Jesus mean when He says the fields are “ready for harvest”?
3. How did the woman’s testimony impact her whole town?

Discussion Questions:

- Where is your personal “mission field” (work, school, neighborhood, family)?
- Who are the people you already interact with that may be open to Christ?
- How can we stay alert to opportunities around us instead of missing them?

Application: Identify your mission field. Share one place/person you’ll focus on.

Next Step: Start 1 spiritual conversation this week.

Week 3 Telling Your Story

Big Idea: Your story is one of your greatest evangelism tools.

Scripture Reading: Mark 5:1–20

Engaging the Text:

1. What did Jesus do for the man?
2. Why does Jesus send him home instead of letting him follow as a disciple?
3. What effect did his story have on the people in his community?

Discussion Questions:

- What's one way Jesus has changed your life that others need to hear?
- How comfortable do you feel sharing your story? What makes it hard?
- How can we make our story simple and clear?

Application: Practice sharing your 3-minute testimony with the group.

Next Step: Share your testimony with one person this week.

Week 4 Walk Through The Door

Big Idea: When God opens a door, step through with courage.

Scripture Reading: Acts 8:26–40

Engaging the Text:

1. What did Philip do when the Spirit told him to approach the Ethiopian?
2. How did Philip use Scripture to point to Jesus?
3. What was the Ethiopian's response?

Discussion Questions:

- Have you ever missed an open door for the Gospel? What held you back?
- How can we be more sensitive to the Spirit's leading in daily life?
- What does it look like to step through open doors with courage?

Application: Brainstorm ways to invite others to church or to have conversations about faith.

Next Step: Invite 3 people to church this week.

Week 5 Hospitality as Evangelism

Big Idea: Hospitality opens hearts to the Gospel.

Scripture Reading: Luke 19:1–10

Engaging the Text:

1. Why was Zacchaeus eager to see Jesus?
2. What did Jesus do that shocked the crowd?
3. How did opening his home to Jesus change Zacchaeus' life?

Discussion Questions:

- What role has hospitality played in your own journey?
- How can meals, coffee, or kickbacks make people more open to Christ?
- What keeps us from practicing hospitality with people far from God?

Application: Plan one act of hospitality this week (meal, coffee, invite).

Next Step: Host or attend a gathering with someone on your list.

Week 6 Passing the Torch

Big Idea: Evangelism is not just addition; it's multiplication.

Scripture Reading: 2 Timothy 2:1–7

Engaging the Text:

1. What does Paul mean by entrusting to “faithful people who will be able to teach others”?
2. How does the soldier/farmer/athlete imagery help us understand disciple-making?
3. Why is multiplication the goal instead of just addition?

Discussion Questions:

- How has God used someone else to pass the torch to you?
- Who on your prayer list might you intentionally disciple, not just invite?
- What would it look like for Reconcile Church to multiply disciples?

Application: Share stories of what God has done during the past 5 weeks.

Next Step: Personally invite every person on your list to “Invite Sunday.”
