



Michigan Palm Sunday Path FAQs

- **What is the purpose of the Palm Sunday Path?** The Palm Sunday Path is based on the principles of Matthew 25: healing the sick, feeding the hungry, and welcoming the stranger. Just as Jesus entered Jerusalem humbly and peacefully on Palm Sunday, we will enter our capitol in Lansing proclaiming God's values in contrast to the dominant politics of hate, greed, and injustice.
- **When and where is the processional?** We will begin at Pilgrim Church: 125 S Pennsylvania Ave, Lansing at 3:00pm and walk to the capitol. It is approximately one mile. We expect the entire event (processing and program to last 2-3 hours).
- **Who is invited to participate?** All those who believe in the power of equality, peace, and justice from all denominations, all races, all ethnicities, all sexual orientations, all gender identities, and all abilities. There are multiple states participating in this action.
- **What should I expect at this event?** You should expect radical hospitality! A processional that includes singing while carrying signs and palms. Please bring palms from your church services if you are able. At the capitol, expect a 45-minute program that includes music and fantastic speakers.
- **What if I am unable to walk in the processional?** No problem! Meet us at the capitol for the program!
- **Is transportation available?** Different geographic areas across the state are working on transportation. Stay tuned for information for your area!
- **Is there an informational/training available in advance?** Yes, there will be a Zoom on March 4rd at 6pm. Registration for the Zoom will be sent out in advance.
