The heart of Manhattan's fashion district surrounds this rooftop bar, so the Skylark is defined by creativity and style. World-renowned design firm Meyer Devis created this escape from the grit of the NYC lifestyle, so the Skylark touches any occasion with a celebratory mood, whether it is end-of-workday drinks, birthday parties, or anything in between.

The Skylark's best feature is its commitment to hosting private events. The venue is

customizable to individual needs from corporate events, reunions, birthdays, to proposals, and

the rooftop even boasts hosting parties for Broadway shows, movie premieres, and New York

Fashion Week. Each guest is treated with a luxury experience that includes a 250-guest capacity,

the latest technological sound systems, and floor-to-ceiling glass doors to unify the

indoor-outdoor concept.

Unlisted is a refreshing venue true to its location in Freeman Alley, an esteemed

representation of the artistic energy and history of Manhattan's Lower East Side. The intimate

rooftop venue overlooking the Bowery Hotel and other defining elements of the neighborhood

makes this location a hidden gem of Manhattan. Unlisted could be described as unassuming and

perhaps even unorthodox, with its graffiti-inspired décor and Lower Manhattan aesthetic. Floor

11 of the Untitled Hotel hosts Unlisted, and artist Guto Vilaverde created the artwork that welcomes guests.

Freeman Alley's character marries the Unlisted classic NYC mood with the ambiance of its iconic location, through a deliberately curated menu reflecting the art of the street. The "Central Park Martini" and classic hot dog respect NYC traditionalism but are served in trash can and water tower-shaped plateware.

Unlisted's intimate venue makes it the perfect space for a comfy event, holding up to 150 guests. A sound system is available, but a hired DJ is also allowed for celebratory events and parties.
