- Term 1 Report Cards Early Reading Screening
  The purpose of this for Ontario's publicly (Policy/ Program Memorandum 168) funded schools
  to complete annual early reading screenings for all students in Year 2 of Kindergarten through
  Grade 2. Early reading screening is a process of assessing a student's foundational reading in
  the early years of school. It involves administering a series of measures to identify students
  who may be at risk for reading difficulties. Early reading screening is used to inform educators
  as they provide instruction, and further intervention supports to students.
