Special Guest Francesca Hong (After Principal Updates)

- 1. Intro: State Assembly Representative for District 76 which includes Lapham and Marquette and Lapham-Marquette parent, Francesca Hong, is joining us! She is going to share strategies to encourage community participation to start writing, calling or testifying to help shape our school budget!
- 2. SLIDES
- 3. Budget Process:
 - a. State Legislature: Has the power of the purse. State Income Tax. Every Odd-numbered Year we set the budget. Evers has set his budget in February. Very pro-kid. Joint Finance Committee (JFC) will set the final budget and then the legislature finalizes it. JFC will hold 4 listening sessions. These won't be near Madison. In June, the legislature will meet and vote on a budget.
 - b. Evers Budget: Note Asking for \$1.1 Billion Special Ed reimbursement to up it from 30% reimbursement to 60%. Revenue Limits were set decades ago and haven't been adjusted for inflation in 16y. Yet we know that costs have increased significantly. Basically the state has been underfunding our schools. So then localities need to raise Property Taxes to cover the cost to meet needs of students. And Referenda are also used because State has been grossly underfunding our schools.

- c. We have a \$4.3 billion surplus so we can do the full 90% reimbursement for Special Ed. The funding should be coming from our state. Their goal is to privatize our schools, but we shouldn't be
- 4. Advocacy & Messaging:
 - a. So What Can We do As Public School Champions? Organize.
 - **b. Be An Effective Messenger:** Tell Robin Vos that our property taxes are too high because he won't fund schools
 - c. Public Schools Unite Us: This section has language that's value-based and positive. Words like Providing instead of Investing. When we take care of all of our cares and have a strong, shared future. "We know what kids need. We have the money. Let's get it done!"
 - **d.** What to do? It can be as simple as having a dinner party. Having the discussion with friends and neighbors.
 - i. <u>WI Public Education Network</u> has great tools. How to connect with folks and messaging. Rural districts are really hurting and connecting with those folks will help
 - ii. MTI Advocacy Training
 - iii. Show Up to listening sessions that the Joint Finance Committee (JFC) is holding. Perfect your 1-2min pitch. Share something personal
 - iv. Write to your Legislature. Help folks in other districts
 - v. Stay engaged throughout the budget process and follow it closely
 - e. **Rep Hong** sees a lane to make movement amongst Republicans as long as we stay vocal and rally across the aisle.
 - i. This is directly related to the top issue The Economy. Public Ed is truly an issue that unites all Wisconsinites

Email from Ms.Wahl (Marquette & O'Keefe Strings Teacher) Note: Some emails incorrect - full email list below her email

"Despite the \$100 million referendum that was "not just about sustaining, but about thriving" schools and that was supposed to "ensure vital investments in staff and student programs", and despite the opening of 420 units of family housing in our attendance areas, O'Keeffe will lose the equivalent of 3 full-time positions and we have heard that East will lose the equivalent of 8 full-time positions for the 2025-26 school year. When determining these staffing cuts, MMSD did not factor in the new housing units in the student enrollment projections for next year. This staffing reduction at O'Keeffe will result in the loss of:

- 1 6th grade core teacher
- 2 SEA (Special Ed Assistants)
- 0.5 CC teacher (Special Ed teacher)
- 0.1 Math Intervention teacher
- 2 sections of art
- 2 sections of maker space
- 2 sections of gym
- 1 section of orchestra

We have heard that the 8.0 staffing reduction at East will result in the loss of:

- 1 English teacher
- 1 Math teacher
- 1 Science teacher
- 1 History teacher
- 1 CC teacher (Special Ed teacher)

Principal Inda fought against the O'Keeffe reductions and won back 1 full-time position (from the original cut of 4 full-time positions). There is nothing more that he can do. If you would like to share your thoughts about how these staffing cuts will affect your child(ren) or what you think about this decision with MMSD, here are some options:
