State Testing

The state standardized test of literacy, mathematics and science will take place soon at Folsom. This test is required of all students in grades 3-8. The Vermont Comprehensive Assessment Program (VTCAP) is a computer-based, adaptive test from the Cognia company. Students in grades 3-9 take tests in English Languages Arts and Math. Students in grades 5 and 8 are tested in science as well. The tests are designed to measure students' proficiency toward Common Core standards. The test is one data point among many that we collect to help us understand how your student in learning. We understand that your children are unique individuals who learn in many different ways. We know that while this data gives us some feedback on what students are learning, it is not the only measure.

Kestrels!
