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My current philosophy of special education is coming from my current work experience of being a paraprofessional. Special education also known as SPED is when a child is in need of extra assistance to accompany their individual differences. Most of them need one on one assistance with additional guidance because they are further off from their peers. The children that have learning disabilities that interfere with their learning from the ages 3-21 are covered by IDEA while, Section 504 covers more of the handicapped individuals. Yet, all IDEA students are covered under Section 504 far as, not all Section 504 are not covered under IDEA. This is a great impact for students with disabilities by protecting their rights and allowing them services to better educate them.

Students with disabilities face many obstacles like bullying, negativity not only from their peers but teachers too, adjusting to differences, and meeting academic standards. In my classroom, I will assist my students in overcoming these difficulties by learning about their differences and unique abilities, go the extra mile to accommodate any needs that's needed for them to grow within my class and encourage them in and out of school. This will give me the opportunity to enhance my knowledge of disable children. Boosting their self-esteem and letting them see that their abilities are one of a kind that can blossom into greater success. Although students with disabilities are labeled differently they may learn better in a classroom with normal students. It helps
