Charles Dimpsey Chase, 87, of Rancho Viejo, TX, passed away peacefully on October 12, 2005 at Sunshine Haven.



He was born **CHASE** November 24, 1917 in Oshkosh, WI, the son of the late Gladys Hart and Edwin D. Chase. He attended Oshkosh State College and married Evelyn A. Roe of Oshkosh on December 3, 1938. During World War II, he served as an Intelligence Sergeant in the 373rd Anti-aircraft Artillery in Bougainville and the Philippines. After the war, he returned to Oshkosh and was President of the E.D. Chase Company before retiring and moving to Rancho Viejo, TX.

Mr. Chase was formerly a member of the Optimist Club, Elks Club #292, Oshkosh Country Club and the First Presbyterian Church of Oshkosh. He was a member of the American Legion, the Rancho Viejo Country Club, the Men's Golf Association and the First Presbyterian Church of Brownsville, TX.

T/Sgt. Charles D. Chase, 222 Algoma boulevard, was with the 373rd antiaircraft artillery searchlight battalion and won the Philippine liberation service ribbon with bronze star, good conduct medal, American theater service ribbon, Asiatic - Pacific theater service ribbon with two bronze stars and three overseas service bars. He entered service Oct. 23, 1943.
