

For External Rated Contests, there are two types of contests. Both types are subject to availability.

Type 1:

- Codechef will not pay for the problems
- The title of the contest will be Starters - no mention of the organizer
- In the announcement blog posts, we'll write that it is organized by XYZ, and add the main sponsor given by the organizer. (eg. "Coding Club, XYZ University, sponsored by ABC").
- The organizer can add their own banner which can have one logo of their sponsor. This banner has to be given to the CodeChef team at least 1 week in advance and will be vetted by the CodeChef team. The banner should adhere to CodeChef's brand guidelines.
- The organizers should mention their main sponsor to CodeChef at least 1 month prior, and should not be a direct competitor of CodeChef. The CodeChef team will have to approve that the sponsor is fine.

Type 2:

- CodeChef will pay for the problem setting (50% of normal contest [compensation](#))
- The title of the contest will be Starters - no mention of the organiser
- In the announcement blog posts, we'll write the organiser's name (eg. "Coding Club, XYZ University")
- In the banners, we'll mention that it's "Organised by XYZ", but no sponsors of the organizers. We might add some sponsors of CodeChef
- In the contest page, we'll write that it's organised by XYZ.
- No mention of the organizers' sponsors anywhere on CodeChef or the blog posts. The organizers can include it in the social media promotions that they do. And we can hyperlink the fest's homepage / some page from the contest page - and they can list their sponsors there
