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INTRODUCTION

This template should be used as a guide for the format and layout of articles to be published in the JLI Journal. Authors must follow all writing guidelines, including font type, font size, layout, word count, structure, and citation style. Authors must also ensure that the article is written in proper and correct Indonesian.

The main body of the article, including the bibliography, is written in a single column as shown in this template. Each new paragraph must be indented by one tab. Submitted articles must be in Microsoft Word format, with A4 paper size, top and left margins of 2.54 cm, right and bottom margins of 2.54 cm, and single line spacing. The font used in the main body of the article is (Times New Roman (Body), Font Size 11).

Punctuation marks (periods, commas, colons, semicolons, parentheses, quotation marks, question marks, exclamation points, slashes, etc.) are not preceded by a space and are not followed by a space, except when a period or comma is used as a decimal separator. Examples of the use of this section can be found throughout this template.

The main introduction section should include the rationale for the research, supported by a literature review (theoretical). The introduction is expected to include as many citations as possible from scientific journals (preferably from reputable national and international journals).

To make it easier for authors, technically, authors may use this template in its entirety. Authors may adapt the entire content of their writing to this template (overwrite) section by section, so that overall, the submitted article is expected to comply with the guidelines. It is advisable to delete as needed to avoid errors in other sections.

RESEARCH METHODS

The research methods used to address the research problem include analytical methods. Figure captions are included as part of the figure title (figure caption) rather than as part of the figure itself. The methods used in the research are described in this section. In the Research Methods section, Doi:

minor and non-essential tools (commonly found in a lab, such as scissors, measuring cups, and pencils) do not need to be listed; instead, only list the main equipment or the primary tools used for analysis and/or characterization, including their type and accuracy; Provide a complete description of the research location, the number of respondents, the methods for processing observation results, interviews, or questionnaires, and the methods for measuring performance metrics; commonly used methods do not need to be described in detail, but simply refer to the reference book. Experimental procedures must be written in declarative sentences, not imperative sentences.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The Results and Discussion section contains the findings of the research and their scientific analysis. Describe the scientific findings derived from the research conducted, but ensure they are supported by adequate data. The scientific findings referred to here are not merely the raw data from the research. These scientific findings must be explained scientifically, addressing: What scientific findings were obtained? Why did this occur? Why does the variable exhibit such a trend? All these questions must be explained scientifically, not merely descriptively, and if necessary, supported by adequate underlying scientific phenomena. Additionally, comparisons with the results of other researchers on similar topics must be explained. Research results and findings must be able to address the research hypothesis stated in the introduction.

Manuscripts may be written in Indonesian or English and must not exceed 20 pages, including figures and tables. Manuscripts must be written according to this article template in camera-ready format. Articles must be written on A4-sized paper (210 x 297 mm) with left margins of 3 cm, right margins of 3 cm, bottom margins of 3 cm, and top margins of 3 cm. Manuscripts must be written in Times New Roman font, size 12 pt, single-spaced, and in a single-column format (except for the article title, author names, and abstract). The space between columns is 1 cm.

Foreign words or terms are written in italics. The use of foreign terms should be avoided in Indonesian-language articles. New paragraphs should begin 1.15 cm from the left margin, and there should be no spacing between paragraphs.

Tables and figures should be placed within the text immediately after they are referenced. Each figure must have a figure caption below it, consisting of a sequential number followed by the figure title. Each table must have a table caption above it, consisting of a sequential number followed by the table title. Figures must be guaranteed to print clearly (font size, resolution, and line thickness must ensure clear printing). Figures, tables, and diagrams/schematics should be placed within columns between blocks of text or, if too large, centered on the page. Tables must not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines are permitted but only where essential.

The use of tables and figures must be referenced in the text by citing Table 1; Figure 1, and so on.

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
