

Education

The Génadema spends on average 1 dhanay per day (6 per week) on food, lodging, and laundry per student. It charges 10 dhanay per week (4 per week for tuition).

Each standard term lasts nine weeks, with a 1-week orientation, 7 weeks of regular classes, and a week of summary/examination. Classes are held 9-11, 11-1, and 4-6 (though the first 15 minutes is lost to socializing). 1-4 is lunch and siesta. 6-7 is informal talking, dinner is 7:30-8:30, and students can then study and relax 8:30-midnight.

Terms are usually grouped as follows: Spring, 9 wks, 1 wk off (Bolérenménu and Dhébelménu), 9 wks (Blorménu thru 4th wk Kaiménu); summer, 2 wks off, 5 wk term (Dhonménu + 1 wk), 1 wk off, 5 wk term, 2 wks off (through 4th wk of Brénménu); Fall, 9 wks, 1 wk off (2 wks Brénménu, 6 wks Génménu, 2 wks Prusménu), 9 weeks (3 wks Prusménu, all of Belménu); winter, 1 wk off, 5 wk intensive term (Plowménu), 5 wks off (εjnaménu); (total 65 wks) (Note: εjnaménu through Abélménu have 5 weeks each)

Year 10: Melwika Génadema reschedules: Spring, 9 wks, 1 wk off (Bolérenménu and Dhébelménu), 5 wks (Blorménu); summer, 2 wks off, 5 wk term (3 wks Kaiménu and 2 wks Dhonménu), 5 wk term (3 wks Dhonménu and 2 wks Abélménu), 5 wk term (3 wks Abélménu and 2 wks Brénménu); vacation (1 wk); Fall, 9 wks, 1 wk off (3 wks Brénménu, 6 wks Génménu), 5 wks (all of Prusménu + 1 week vacation), 5 wks (all of Belménu + 1 wk vaca), 5 wks (5 wks of Plowménu), 5 wks (1 wk Plowménu and 4 wks εjnaménu); 1 wk off;

Courses meet 3 hours a week (9-wk term) or 6 hours per week (5-wk term). Class periods are 9-12:15, 2-5:15, 6-9:15. For all but the last week, courses also meet on two Suksdius. Courses meet once for 3-hour exams the last week. Courses thus involve 33 hours total (equivalent of a quarter-course, not a semester-course).

A student typically takes 2 courses in a 5-wk term and 4 in a 9-wk term. Students need 12 courses per “year.” It is possible, taking courses every term, to complete 20 per year. A dwoyeri is possible in a year, including a series of summer or a series of winter terms twice.

Génadema for 500 students, 50 faculty, 150 support staff (many students); $28,368/700 = 40$ sq. meters each. (Holy Cross College has 500 students and about 33,000 sq. meters of space, 61 faculty, 36 staff). By end of 7-yr plan capacity must expand to 1300 students/yr.

For every 15 students, one faculty, who needs:

1 office, 4 by 4 meters, 16 sq. m

2.5 support staff, 40 sq. m

0.6 classrooms, $100 \text{ sq. m} / 0.6 = 60 \text{ sq. m}$.

0.3 labs, etc., = 30 sq. m.

Thus 1 faculty needs about 150 sq. m., or about 10 sq. m. per student served

Melwika School system, yr 13:

Elementary School: 4,000 students, 120 classrooms

Middle School: 2,000 students, 60 classrooms

High School: 1,500, 45 classrooms

Investment: each school has 20 classrooms [3,000 dhanay each, total of 666 students], library (4,000), auditorium (12,000), 3 offices (1,000 each); hallways, exterior landscaping, 6,000; total 85,000 each

Total schools: 6 elementary, 3 middle, 2 high

With 1,500 new first graders every year, the city is building 2.5 new schools per year (212,000 dhanay per year of investment). Generally, kids stay in the same school through end of middle school.

Average classroom size: 10 by 10 meters
