As some of you may have already noticed, the WBALA is being administered by new staff. After a recent conversation between WBALA and AIA Wyoming, the groups felt an explanation regarding the difference between the two would be beneficial to licensees. WBALA (that's us) was created by the Wyoming Legislature in 1951 to regulate the profession of architecture. In 1991 the Wyoming Legislature added the regulation of landscape architecture to WBALA. The purpose of the Board is to regulate the professions for the purpose of public protection. Ensuring the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Wyoming is the primary duty of the Board. Conversely, the state associations (such as AIA Wyoming and ASLA Colorado) are created to support and advocate for you, the licensed professionals. While WBALA and associations are pleased to collaborate, their roles and functions are very different.
