Student Guidelines for selecting a service learning project

Service learning projects should focus on community needs. Students are asked to research and identify organizations or groups of people that will benefit from your involvement. To do so please reach the following guidelines:

- All activities must be performed without financial compensation.
- All activities must be completed outside of your instructional day
- Supervisors of community service must be at least 18 years old, not currently a student at CHS and someone other than a member of your immediate family.

Examples of Unacceptable Service Learning Activities: (Activities that fall under this category will NOT be approved)

- Any service learning activity whose chief purpose is to serve a student's own family and which does not extend the
 benefit of the service activity to other families in need cannot be counted towards the service-learning graduation
 requirements
- Any service-learning activity that violates federal or state laws which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, sex, age, national origin, religion, or disability cannot be counted towards your service-learning graduation requirement.
- Any community service that is court ordered cannot be used towards the service-learning graduation requirements.
- Any service-learning activity whose chief purpose is to increase the amount of revenue for a private for profit business or to generate new revenue for that business cannot be counted towards the service-learning graduation requirement.
- Any service-learning activity that replaces a paid staff worker of the participating agency or institution with a student earning service-learning credit cannot be counted toward the service-learning graduation requirement.
- Any service-learning activity that compensates a student with money, goods, or services such as the service-learning
 activity is performed in expectation of both the service-learning credit and the money, goods, or service cannot be
 counted towards the service-learning graduation requirement.
- Any service-learning activity that is not secular in nature, that either advances or inhibits religion entanglement with religion or that fosters excessive entanglement with religion cannot be counted towards the service learning graduation requirement.

- a. Essay must be at least 250 words.
 - I. **First paragraph** Include the following information: what the service project was about? What organization did you work with? Who was the community partner/supervisor? How did your community partner/supervisor help you to be successful?
 - II. **Second paragraph** Include the following information: what did you learn from your service learning project? What challenges did you face? What did you learn about yourself? How did you use self-direction and problem solving skills?
 - III. **Third paragraph** Include the following information: how did your service contribute to the community? How did your service impact your attitude(s) towards the people you worked to help? When considering the future, how will this service learning project impact how you feel about community service for the common good?
- b. Completed essays should be returned attached to the affirmation form.
