Like many of you, I've enjoyed many great times and experienced some not-so-good times.

I attended MSU for a year and then transferred to Michigan, where I blew through several natural science majors and played on the lacrosse club. I also continued playing backup guitar for Jay Steilstra around town. I finally settled on geology and earned my B.S. in '79.

I worked for ERIM for a bit but then headed west a few weeks after Mount St. Helens erupted. I lived out of my pickup truck (primarily camping, hiking, backpacking, & bicycling) before returning to A2 in the fall to work as a carpenter. I also sailed across Lake Huron to Canada & back in early October with some friends. One night, a storm pummeled us, and we barely made it into a Canadian harbor, where we bumped into Cousteau's lead crew that was preparing to study the "Gales of November" on the Great Lakes.

When temperatures warmed in the spring, I headed west again in my truck. I ended up living with several geology majors who attended Colorado College, and I landed a job working as a land surveyor. I was living my dream in Colorado and bagging fourteeners with my new cadre of friends.

However, that dream came to an end when some graduate schools extended offers. So, I headed to Texas in '82 and served as the T.A. for their summer geology field camp before I began classes in the fall. That December, I ran my first marathon, which started a life-long love of running (I ran a half marathon this past April). My research focused on shell geochemistry, and I earned my Master's Degree in paleontology in '84. I then headed to the University of Iowa for my doctorate in paleontology. I also spent a summer in East Greenland collecting single-celled fossils from Proterozoic rocks (~750 million years old). And I studied the effects of deforestation on coral reefs along Panama's coast. Later, while conducting solo fieldwork in the Arbuckle Mountains, a rockslide enveloped me. As the rocks and I cascaded over a small cliff and hit bottom, I suffered a compound fracture of my femur—the month in the hospital and the recovery were not fun. While in Iowa, I also started racing bicycles competitively, rode RAGBRAI twice, whitewater kayaked in Wisconsin many times (though after I perfected my kayak

roll, I became too cocky, got Maytagged in a hole at the bottom of a small waterfall, and broke two teeth).

I married after graduation and worked at the Iowa Geological Survey. Our research group investigated groundwater degradation due to agricultural chemicals. I also picked up a job on the side as a visiting Assistant Professor of Geology at Grinnell College, which changed my career trajectory. I now wanted to teach at a small, private liberal arts college rather than pursue a career at an R1 university. I'm so glad I did.

The following year, Juniata College hired me, and we moved to central Pennsylvania. A few years later, Kyle, our first son, was born. What a magical experience. (He earned a BS in mathematics at Oberlin College, attended College Semesters in Mathematics in Budapest, and earned his Master's in biostatistics from the Gillings School of Global Public Health at the University of North Carolina. He then started working on Phase I, II, and III clinical trials for cancer drugs & a few years ago also began working on his PhD in statistics).

We began to feel limited in the Appalachian Mountains of Pennsylvania. So, I accepted a teaching position at Ohio Wesleyan University in '97. I also developed a research program with a series of students working on the number, rate, and extent of sea-level incursions into the Midwest that occurred during the Middle Devonian (397 to 385 million years ago), when North America resided just south of the equator.

The birth of Mason in May '98 filled my heart with great joy. Three years later, I built a summer/retirement home in northern Michigan with the help of two former students. Over the following years I also built the cabinets and furniture. (Mason went on to attend Georgia Tech University, studied in France, and earned his B.S. during the pandemic, with no ceremony. He continued his studies there, earned his Master's Degree, and so we did get to see him graduate! He's now on the faculty at New York University, lives in Brooklyn, and thoroughly enjoys the city's creative scene.)

In 2005, unbeknownst to me, trouble loomed on the horizon. My spouse wanted a divorce and then moved to Arizona. Several months later, I officially became a full-time single dad—what luck! Plus, I had a great role model, my dad. After my mom died of cancer when I was in third grade, he raised my sister and me by himself.

Luckily, in 2007, I met my kindred spirit, Claudia, who also had two kids. She grew up in Milwaukee, graduated from the University of Wisconsin and then Indiana University, and is a Professor of Sociology at Ohio State University. She also loves to camp, bicycle, hike, cross-country ski, alpine ski, sail, and canoe! We began blending our families while planning our wedding for the summer of 2011.

But in November 2010, I learned I had a rare form of a rare cancer. I tried giving Claudia a way out of my predicament before we married, but she just looked at me and said, "No way." What a lucky guy I am! We traveled to the University of Michigan for

my treatment because they specialized in my cancer type. Since my tumor would not respond to chemotherapy or radiation, I had two surgeries (followed by scans for five years). I've been NED ever since!

Unfortunately, in May 2011, a hit-and-run driver left my oldest son and his bicycle on the side of the road. When I arrived at the emergency department, a doctor told me, "If your son had not been wearing his helmet (which had broken into several pieces), we would be having an entirely different conversation right now." He suffered a shattered jaw and many other injuries that required a string of surgeries over the following two years.

Thankfully, he healed completely! Claudia and I did get married Up North, and Kyle played "Blackbird" by the Beatles on his guitar, one of Claudia's favorite songs.

Blending our families worked far better than we had hoped. Also, Claudia's oldest child became a geology major at The College of Wooster and now works for a geotechnical engineering firm in Columbus, Ohio. And her youngest will be a senior at Denison University in Granville, Ohio, this fall.

I absolutely loved being a geology professor. It was the perfect job for me. I could not have invented a better job for myself. Nonetheless, I retired from Ohio Wesleyan University, along with 40 other senior faculty members, during the pandemic.

I have thoroughly enjoyed retirement. I often feel like a three-year-old: I want to do so many things (traveling and doing things with Claudia, building furniture, running races, pursuing photography, writing essays, leading geology field trips in the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore . . .) all at once!

We hosted Kyle's wedding last week at our place near the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore. And now, Mason and I are building an art studio addition to that house. Claudia will soon retire and looks forward to dedicating more time to her oil painting in that art studio (she's already had several solo art shows in Glen Arbor). I'll also use it for photography.

Claudia and I hold our marriage dearly and realize, after our earlier experiences, how lucky we are. We swim in gratitude daily.
