You may need to assist your child in cutting and gluing/ taping the two animal strips together. The long strip of animals should be attached to the old lady's head. Fold the animal squares like an accordian so they can fold into the old Lady's mouth to look like the lady is eating them. After you are both done making your tower, both of you can count how many blocks it took to create the tower. Write the total on a piece of paper. Then your child can say whether their tower had more or less blocks. See the picture below as an example:	What Melts In the Sun *Gather objects from your home (lego, pat of butter, chocolate, ice, block, chese, crayon) *Place the objects into a cupcake tin or tray and place outside in the sun * Set a timer for different times and go back and check *Observe and record what you see https://frugalfun4boys.com/si mple-science-experiment-for-k ids-what-melts-in-the-sun/	Still Life Paintings/Drawings *Gather a few of one type of item and place them in the middle of the table (flowers, fruit, legos). Items should be fairly simple shapes *Sit at the table in front of the items and talk about the parts - what is on the bottom? The top? What colors do you see? Shapes? *Using paints, crayons, or markers, and paper, try to draw/paint the items on your paper. *The beauty of this project is no two people ever draw something exactly the same way! Sit with your child and draw with them and talk about what makes each unique and beautiful! Tell A Story Using Pictures

Open the attached link. Have your child look at the story pictures of the cat. Encourage your child to "read" the pictures left to right. Help your child to use his/her language to tell a story of the cat using language; repeat and rephrase adding the words: first, then, next, last. Ask your child to use words to answer: what did the cat do first. next, last? You can also work on ordinal positions (for older children, work on ordinal numbers first, second, third, fourth) Next, help your child to do the same with the painting story. It would be great if you could write down the story that your child told and re-read a few times. Can your child think of a good title for each story?

Seed Count

*Gather a small bowl of seeds or other small item such as dried beans or dry rice

*Roll the die, find the cup, put that many "seeds" into the cup
*Roll again. If you get a number that already has seeds in, your turn is skipped

*To create more of a
challenge, use two dice and
add the numbers together use numbers 7-12 on the cups
*To make it easier, take out
the die and just count the
seeds into each cup based

<u>Create your own rainstorm:</u> Materials:

A cup or jar, Shaving cream or cotton balls, Water, Food coloring

Directions:

*Fill your cup or jar ¾ of the way with water *Add shaving cream or cotton balls on top of the water *In a separate cup mix some water with food coloring (or leave it clear) *Slowly pour the water from the separate cup over the shaving cream/cotton balls *Repeat until you see it start coming out of the bottom and going into the rest of the water

Counting Carrots-

Number recognition, 1:1 correspondence and scissor skills

You will need:

*Construction paper- brown, green and orange (if you do not have these colors you can use what you have and color the pieces in).

- *Scissors
- *Glue or tape

Directions:

- *Cut 5 orange triangle write numbers 1-5 on them *Cut 15 green paper strips *Glue the green strip to the triangle carrot that corresponds with the number
- *Glue onto brown paper

The Rubber Egg Materials:

*An egg (either cooked or raw... however brave you're feeling) *A tall drinking glass

*White vinegar

Procedure:

- *Put your egg into a tall drinking glass.
- *Pour vinegar into the glass until the egg is covered.
- *Put the glass aside so no one drinks and/or spills it. It will smell a bit. Vinegar has a strong odor. *Let the egg soak overnight. Make some observations! You should notice a lot of foam and bubbles. When it seems to have slowed, move on to the next step. *Rinse the vinegar and foam out with water and then cover the egg
- again with vinegar.

 *Wait for 6 days. That's a long time but do it; you don't want a half pickled egg in your hands.

Garden Sensory Bin

Fill a plastic bin with potting soil. Add some artificial flowers, small pots, child-size gardening tools and gardening gloves. You can pretend to water your flowers with a toy watering can.
