Exam: Students will complete a project for their final exam grade that relates to their artistic voice and present it to the class. Students will include a written artist statement with their art project. If a student is absent on the exam day they will need to be present during the makeup exam period to turn in their project and receive credit. The exam project cannot be turned in early or late or simply be dropped off at the school.

Class Rules: Failure to follow any of these rules will result in a referral.

- Use of foul/inappropriate language of any kind will not be tolerated.
- Cell Phones:

Cellphone, Earbuds, and Electronic Devices Usage:

During Class Time:

All student cell phones and personal electronic devices must be stored out of sight while in class. These devices can be stored in:

- Bookbags
- Purses
- Pockets

This also includes accessories such as earbuds, headphones, and smartwatches. Listening devices used in conjunction with school-issued Chromebooks will still be allowed at the teacher’s discretion.

Outside of Class Time:

Students may use their cell phones for education-related activities outside of class time such as:

- Checking grades/assignments

- Communicating with teachers
- Working on school group projects
- Navigating the district Backpack system, Classlink, or approved educational applications

Other uses, such as playing games, posting on social media, and listening to music, are prohibited. Accessories such as earbuds, headphones, and gaming systems must remain stored out of sight throughout the school day.

Consequences for Violations:

- 1st offense: School Detention
- 2nd offense: 1 day of ISS
- 3rd offense: 1 day of OSS

- Students may not use their chromebook to watch movies, tv, or any other media that is unrelated to the content of the class.
- Students must follow the SmartPass procedures to leave the classroom and use the restroom. Students may not use the restroom or leave the classroom during the first or last 10 minutes of class. Additionally, students may not be out of the room for more than 10 minutes. Students are expected to have their charged chromebook with them to make their own pass.
- Only ONE student may be out of the room at a time per J L Mann's One Out policy.
- I will move a student's seat if I feel the need to.
- Students will follow J L Mann tardy procedures (HERO system). Tardy students will only be allowed to enter my classroom with the appropriate tardy pass.
- Students are not allowed to eat food or candy during class. Students cannot bring their lunch tray to class.
- Copying or tracing artwork, photos, or images that do not belong to you off of your chromebook or out of a book may result in a zero and/or a referral. It is copyright infringement to steal images, art, etc that are not your own intellectual property and claim them as your own. Students are expected to gather their own collection of reference photos for their art, draw from their imagination, and/or draw from observation.
- Students may not work on assignments for another class while in my class.
- All school rules apply (dress code, SmartPass, etc).
 - "We will comply with the district and school dress code policy. Enforcement of the dress code will be in accordance with all school rules and procedures."

Non-Instructional Routines:

- Be seated in assigned seat when the bell rings and listen for attendance
- The doors to the classroom remain CLOSED during class.
- You must wear your I.D. at all times—displayed properly according to the school handbook. Failure to wear your ID may result in a referral.
- When cleaning at the sink, wash objects completely and place them in the drying rack.
- SHARE supplies like scissors, water jars, and rulers.
- RETURN all materials to their proper places.
- Stay in your assigned seat until the bell rings. Do not line up at the door. Students in a 4th period class will need to stack their chairs on top of the tables at the end of each class.

Grading policy:

- 1) There are two types of projects: major and minor
 - a. Major projects consist of long projects and tests.
 - b. Minor projects consist of short projects, quizzes, sketchbook assignments, and critiques.

- 2) Major projects/tests count for 60 % of your grade and minor projects/quizzes/sketchbook assignments/critiques count for 40 %.
- 3) Your grade on each assignment will be based on a grading rubric I will give to you ahead of time.
- 4) You must turn each assignment in on time through Google Classroom (unless stated otherwise)
- 5) Plagiarism on any writing assignments will result in an automatic 0%.
