# Riz Gukgak

goblin P.I. doll crochet pattern







This pattern is for a doll of our favorite little goblin P.I., Riz Gukgak! The finished doll is approximately  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " tall and has a *small knit section* for his vest. This pattern has a lot of pieces: I recommend making them in the order listed.

Enjoy!

#### You will need:

- Dark grey yarn
- Dark green yarn
- Black yarn
- Light green yarn
- White yarn
- Gold yarn
- Size F crochet hook
- Size 2 knitting needles
- Tapestry needle
- Safety eyes
- Stuffing

#### Abbreviation guide:

MR - Magic Ring

ch - chain stitch

 ${f sc}$  - single crochet

**hdc** - half double crochet

dc - double crochet

tc - triple crochet

k - knit

**p** - purl

co - cast off

[#]/(#) - round number/total number of stitches that round

inc/hdcinc/dcinc - increase in sc/hdc/dc

dec - decrease once in sc

**sc1blo** - single crochet once in the back loop

**sc1flo** - single crochet once in the front loop

(sc, inc) x6 - repeat the pattern in parentheses six times

inc(hdc, sc) - increase with a hdc
then a sc in the same stitch

### Hat - Dark Grey

- [1] MR 6 (6)
- [2] inc x6 (12)
- [3] (inc, sc) x6 (18)
- [4] (inc, sc2) x6 (24)
- [5] (inc, sc3) x6 (30)
- [6] (sc3, dec) x4 (26)
- [7] sc3blo, (dec, sc2) x3, dec, sc8 (22)
- [8] sc4, flo(sc, hdcinc, hdc2, dcinc, hdc2, hdcinc) slip stitch and tie off Leave a long tail for sewing!

#### **Hair - Dark Green**

- [1] ch9 (9) turn work
- [2] loop stitch8, ch (9) turn work
- [3] sc8, ch (9) turn work
- [4] loop stitch8, slip stitch and tie off. These loops can be cut in half for straight hair instead of curly!

Leave a long tail for sewing!

#### Tie - Black

- [1] ch5 (5)
- [2] hdc, sc4 (4) slip stitch and tie off. Leave a small tail for sewing.

The ears are essentially the same pattern, but reversed, so that the "nice" side is facing out for each. Please note this difference, and do not make two of just one of the ears!!

# Right Ear - Light Green

- [1] MR 6 (6)
- [2] scinc, hdcinc, inc(dc, ch, tc, ch, dc), inc(hdc, sc), inc(sc, ch, hdc), sc (15) slip stitch and tie off. Leave a medium tail for sewing.

#### **Left Ear - Light Green**

- [1] MR 6 (6)
- [2] scinc, inc(hdc ch sc), inc(sc, hdc), inc(dc, ch, tc, ch, dc), hdcinc, scinc, (15) slip stitch and tie off. Leave a medium tail for sewing.

### **Arms - Light Green** (make 2)

[1] MR 6 (6)

[2] - [5] sc6 (6)

Switch to White

[6] - [10] sc6 (6), slip stitch and tie off. Sew in end: no need for tail. Stuff.

### Legs - Black (make 2)

- [1] MR 6 (6)
- [2] (inc, sc2) x2 (8)
- [3] sc8 (8)

Switch to Dark Grey

[4] - [10] sc8 (8) slip stitch and tie off.

# Leave a medium tail for sewing on **first leg only**. DO NOT CUT YARN FOR SECOND LEG and continue below

This section crochets the two legs together and continues onto the torso, so be sure to position the color seams where you want them!

[11] ch, sc into first leg, sc6, ch, sc back into second leg

There should be one empty stitch on the 'crotch' area of the legs. Use the tail from leg #1 to sew this gap shut.

[12] Single crochet until you reach the "back" of your doll. This will be the new start of each row, so that the color seams are in the back. (15) [13] sc15 (15) Stuff legs.

Switch to White

[14] - [20] sc15 (15)

This next round attaches the arms. To do so, fold the top of each arm flat, lining up the stitches in two rows of 3. Stick your hook through the arm stitches, then through the stitch on the body, and complete the single crochet stitch by pulling the loop through *all stitches*. Repeat this for the remaining two stitches. This essentially crochets "through" the arm, no sewing required!

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[21] sc5, attach the first arm with sc3, sc4, attach the second arm with sc3, sc3 (15)
Sew on tie. Stuff body.
[22] (sc, dec) x2, sc2, (dec, sc) x2 (11)
Switch to Light Green
[23] sc6, inc, sc4 (12)
[24] (sc, inc) x6 (18)
[25] (sc2, inc) x6 (24)
[26] - [30] sc24 (24)
[31] (sc2, dec) x6 (18)
[32] (sc, dec) x6 (12), slip stitch and tie off. Sew in end: no need for tail.
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#### **Face**

- Place safety eyes
- Tie several knots in a strand of light green for a pointy little nose
- Sew on ears at either side of the head along the short side. Secure it in the center of the MR for a nice curl.
- Sew on hair at the back at the head, approx. 3-4 rows from the top. Just make sure your hat will reach so there's no bald spot!
- For hair floofs, tie a few loops in dark green and sew above the ears and at the center of head.
- Stuff head.

The vest is knitted using *intarsia knitting* to make the back a different color, so you will need two separate strands of dark grey. You're welcome to make it all one color, crochet it instead, or leave it off entirely!

# **Vest - Dark Grey**

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[1] Cast On 22 [22]
[2] (p1, k1) x3, switch to gold, (p1, k1) x5, switch to grey, (p1, k1) x3 (22)
[3] purl row: 6 grey, 10 gold, 6 grey (22)
[4] knit row: 6 grey, 10 gold, 6 grey (22)
[5] - [6] repeat [3] - [4] (22)
[7] repeat [3] (22)
[8] dec, k4 grey, k10 gold, k4 grey, dec (20)
[9] dec, p3 grey, p10 gold, p3 grey, dec (18)
[10] k2 grey, co2 grey, co2 gold, k8 gold, co2 gold, co2 grey, k2 grey (2/6/2)
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Work the first grey strap back and forth until it's approx.  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " -  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " long. When placed on the doll, it should be able to reach over the arm all the way to the back. Cast off and tie off. Leave a short tail for sewing.

#### Vest Back - Gold

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[11] p6 (6)
[12] k6 (6)
[13] - [14] repeat [11] - [12] (6)
[15] repeat [11] (6)
[16] co6, tie off. Leave a short tail for sewing.
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Work the second grey strap the same as the first. Leave a short tail for sewing. Attach each of the straps to the top corners of the back of the vest. Sew in any loose tails. Put vest on doll and sew front shut.

#### **Prop Magnifying Glass - White**

[1] MR 6 (6)Switch to Black[2] (sc, ch) x5, ch1 (11) turn work[3] sc, slip stitch and tie off

# **Prop Gun - Black**

[1] ch8 (8) turn work

[2] sc3, inc(sc3), sc3 (9) slip stitch and tie off

Trigger: tie a loose strand on the inside of the second stitch, leave some slack, and tie the other end to the inside of the next-to-last stitch.

Sew props onto hands and hide the tails. Voila!
