On this occasion, we walk along the path of the Cross of the Victorinos to the bridge of the railway tracks of the Roda de Andalucía (Seville). This route, also known in our town as the yellow road or the realenga, is a crossroads between the province of Malaga and Seville.

At one point of the road, there is a stone cross from 1870 where Francisco Delgado from Alameda was kidnapped by "El Tío Martín", who used his garden in Casariche (Seville) as a meeting place for bandits and kidnappers.

During 3 hours of route, 7 young people shared a sports activity in a healthy environment, in which a stop was made to carry out a meditation in contact with nature.

ENTREJUEGOS continue to promote healthy habits among young people through leisure activities and this project.
