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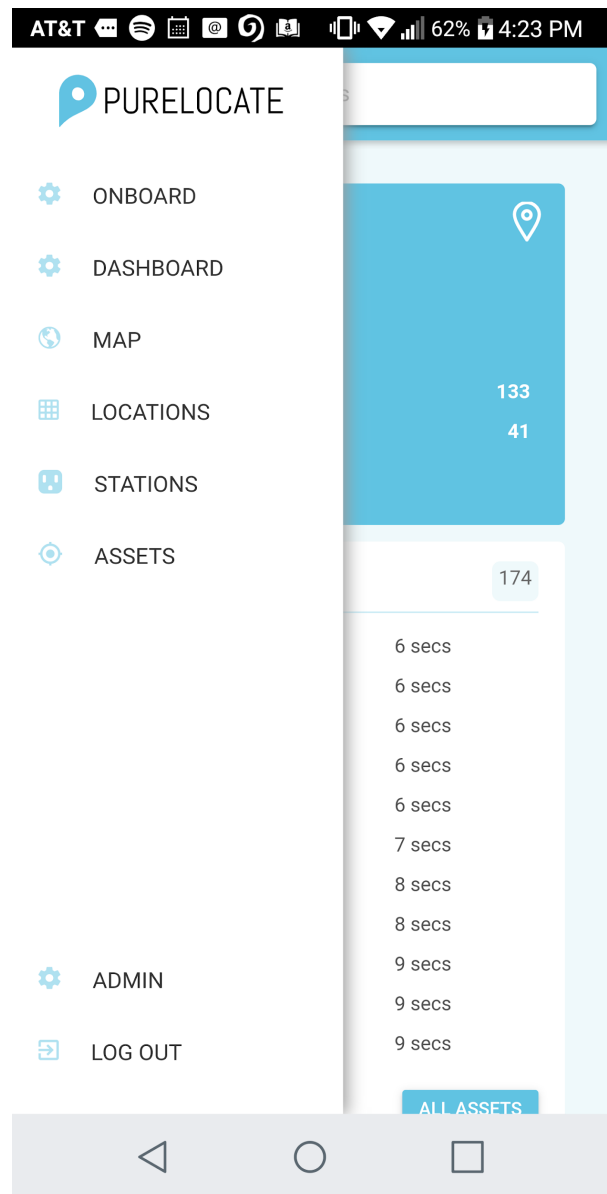
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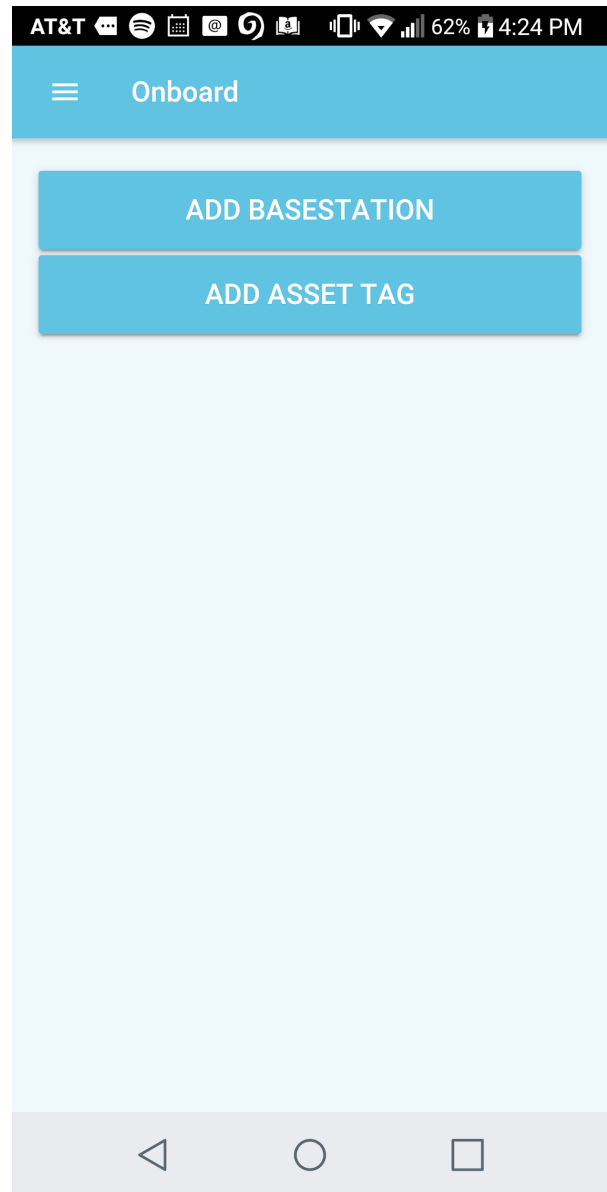

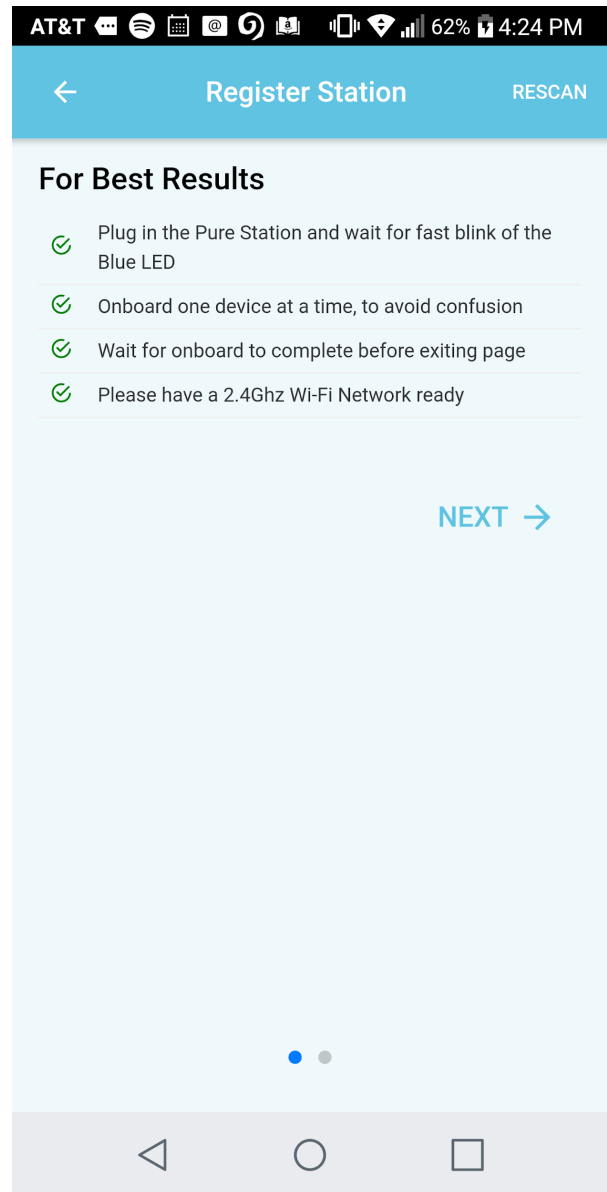
1. Click on the “Onboard”

onboarding page.



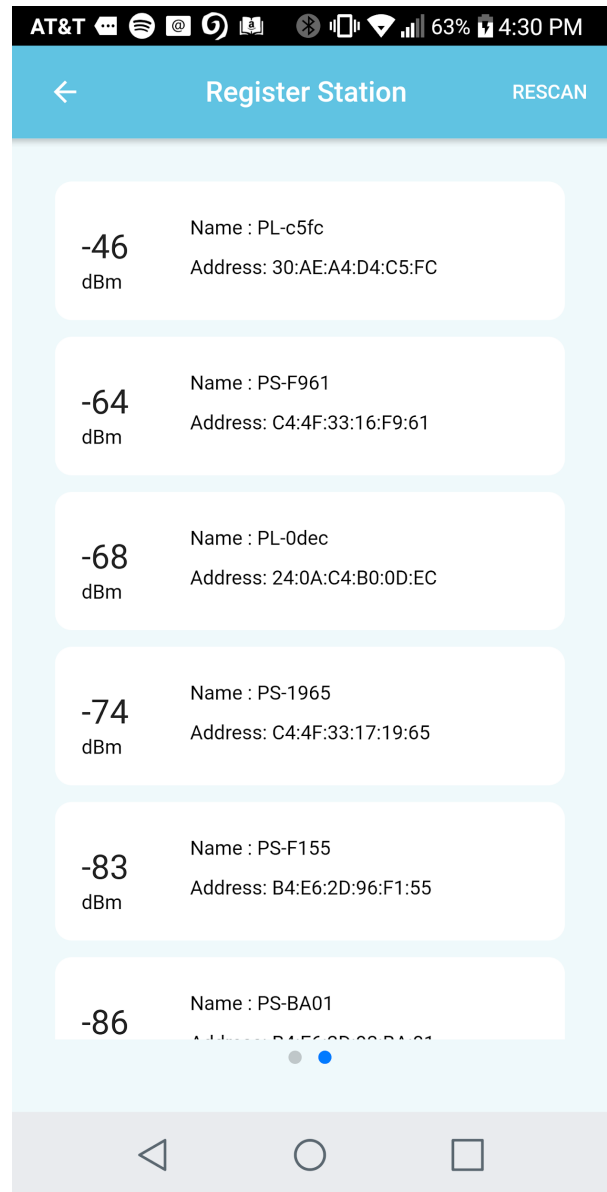
2. Click on “Add Basestation”

“Next”.



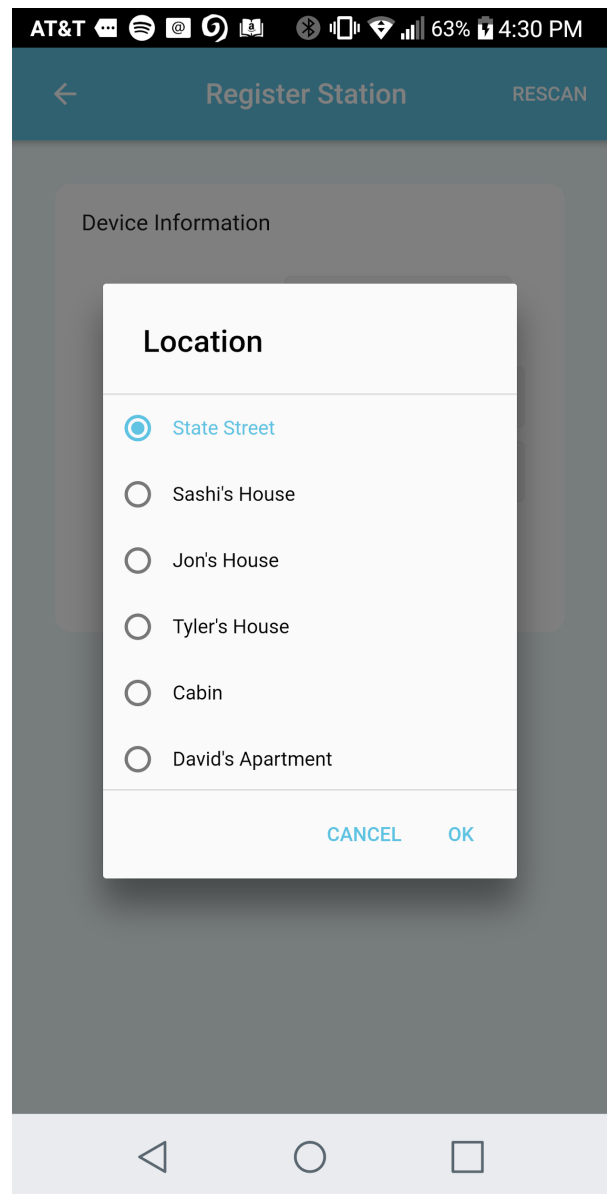
4. Hold your device next to the base station. The closest station will appear on the top of the list. Click on the desired station card.



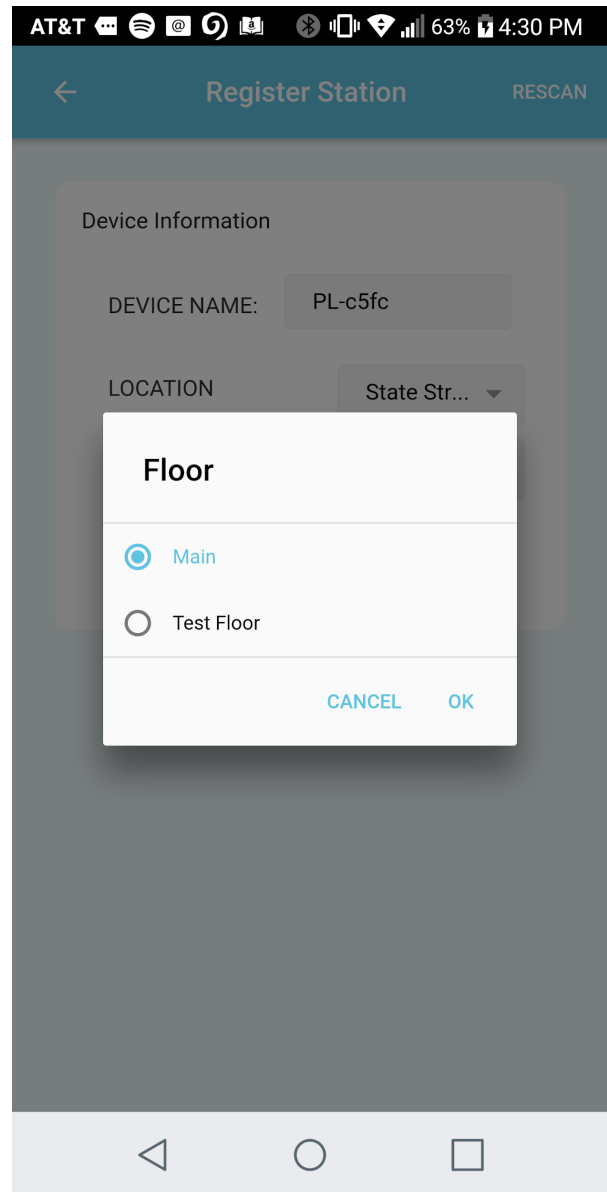
5. If desired, set a custom name for the device.

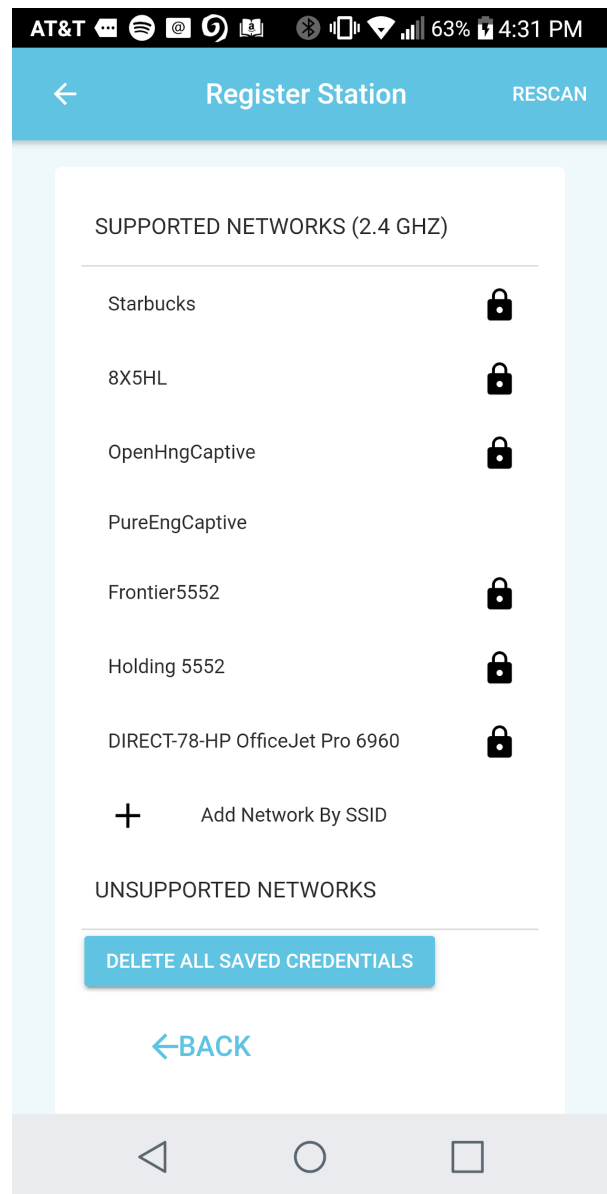
6. Select the desired location for the device in the dropdown menu for locations.



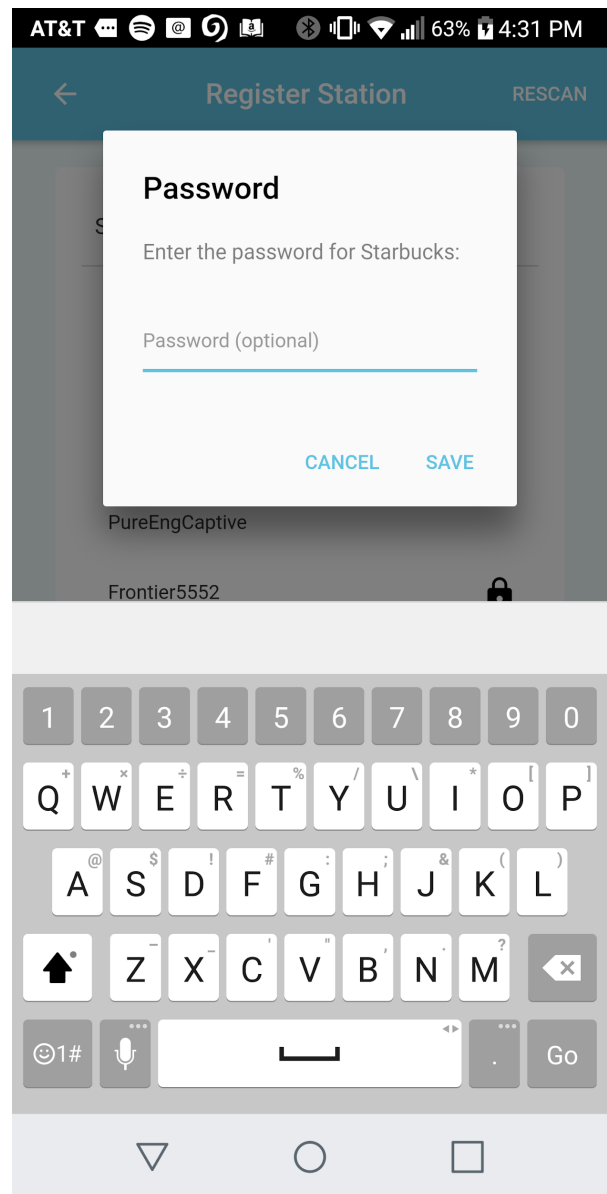
7. Select the desired floor for the device in the dropdown menu for floors.



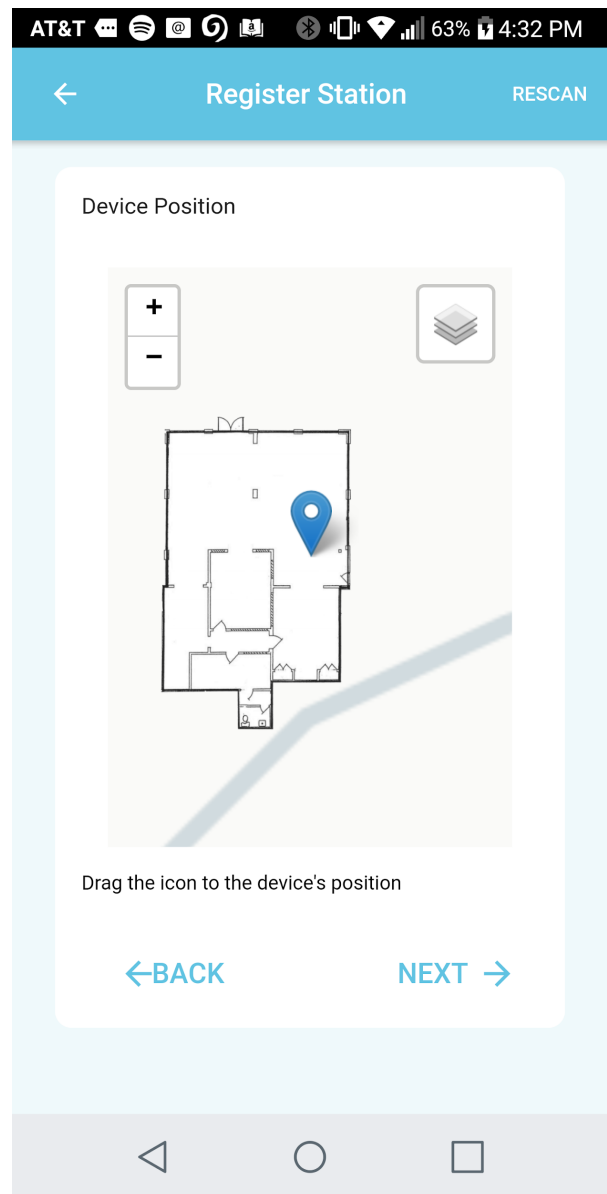
8. Select a network that the device will connect to. The list will be populated automatically. If not you the network can be added manually by pressing on the “Add Network By SSID” button.

11. Verify that the information is correct. Once finished, click on "Confirm and Save".

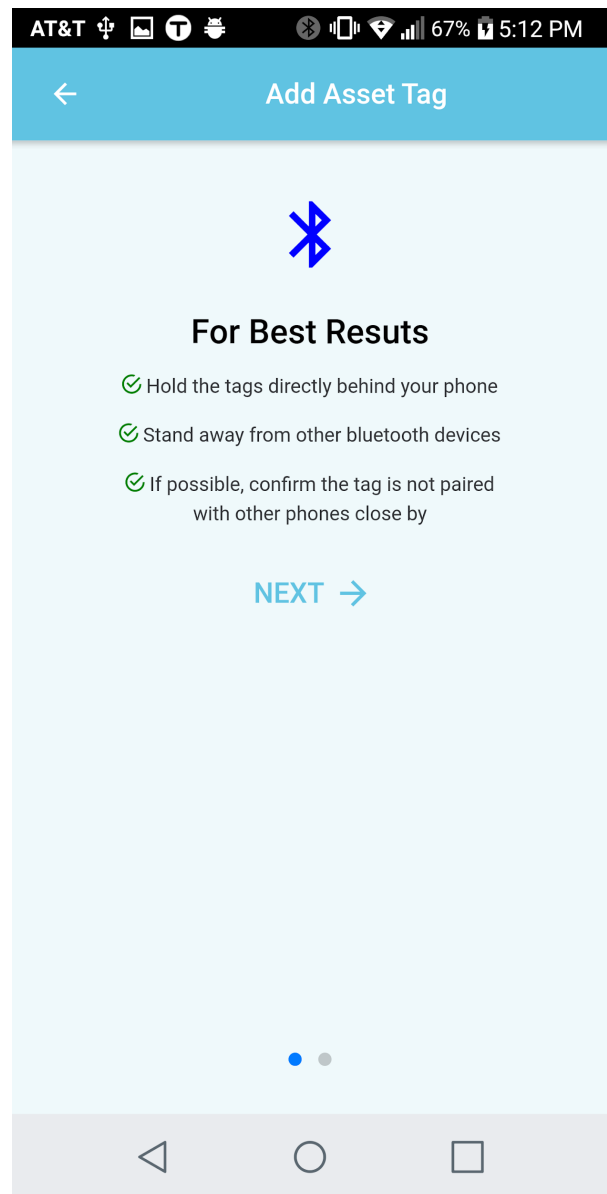

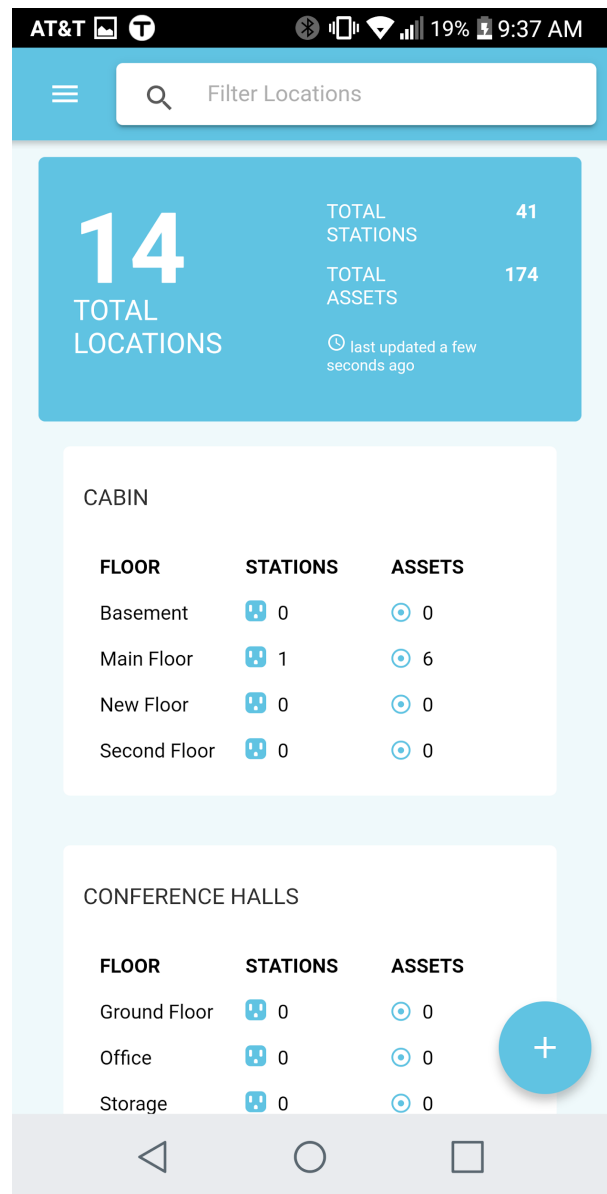

4. Type in the address/coordinates of the newly created location. Alternatively, the map will automatically center to your current GPS location.

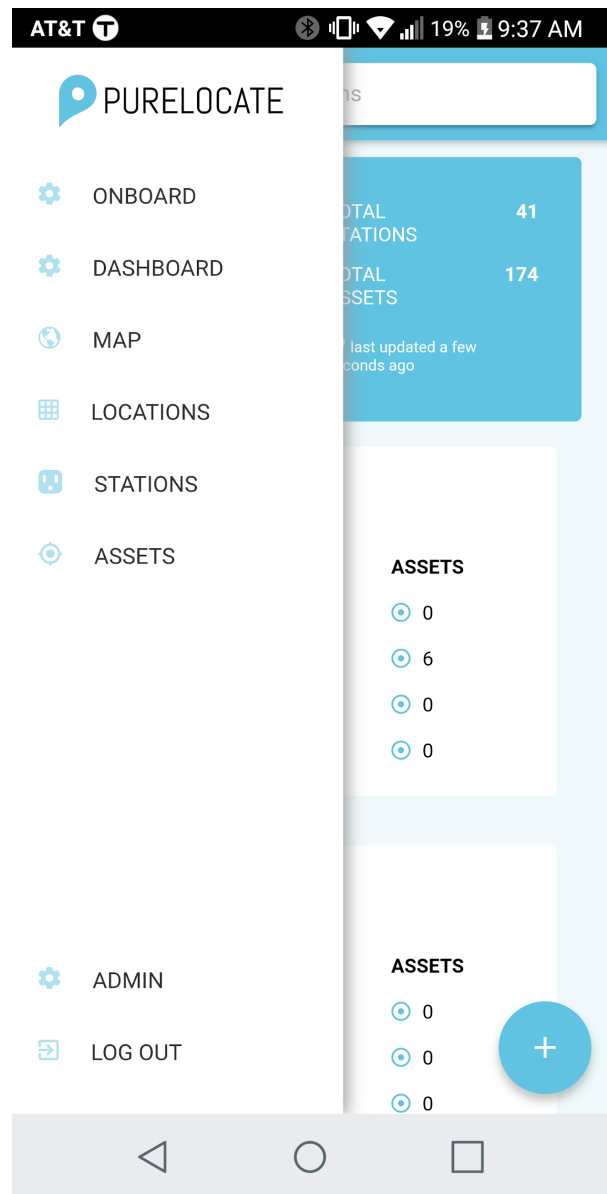


5. Drag the map until the marker is in the desired location. When finished, press the “Update Location”.

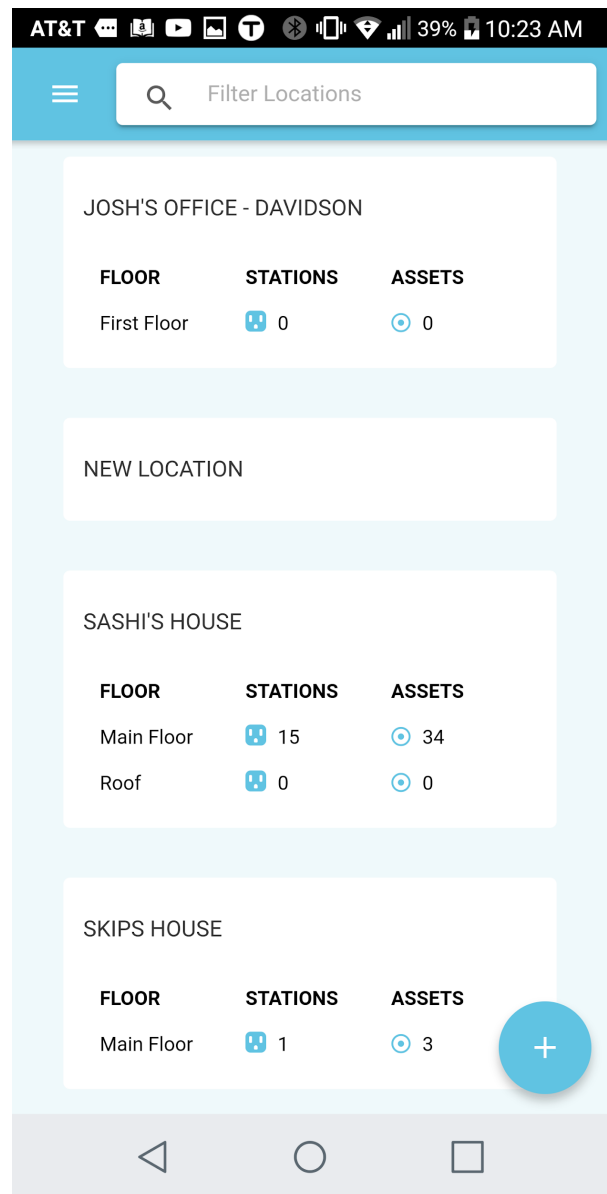


Creating a Floor

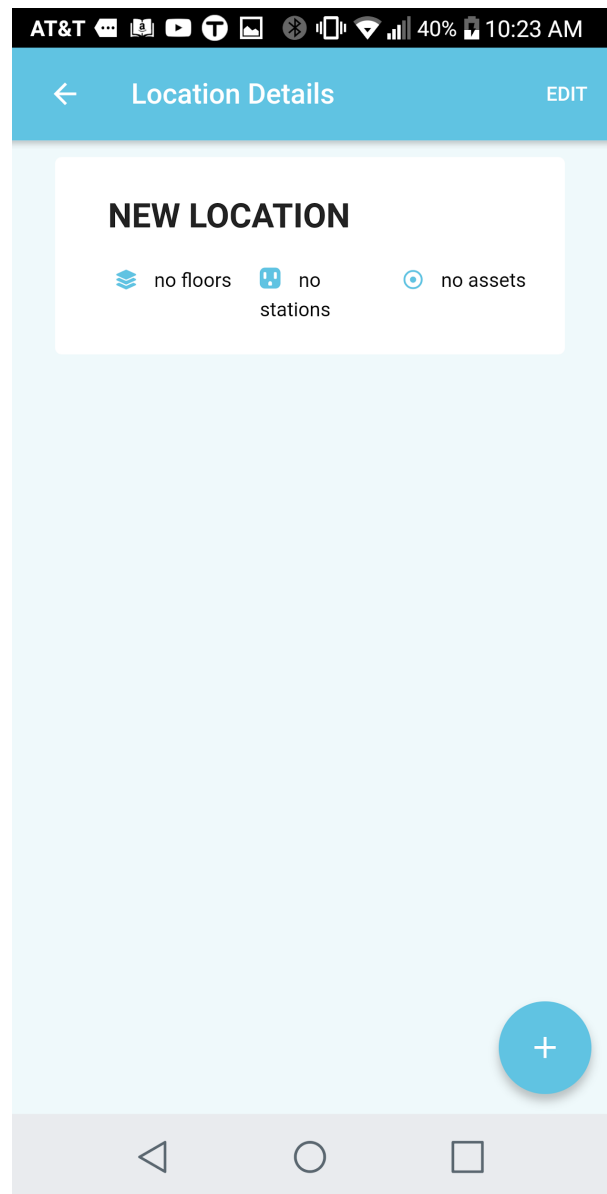
1. Click on the “Locations”

2. Press on the card of the desired location.



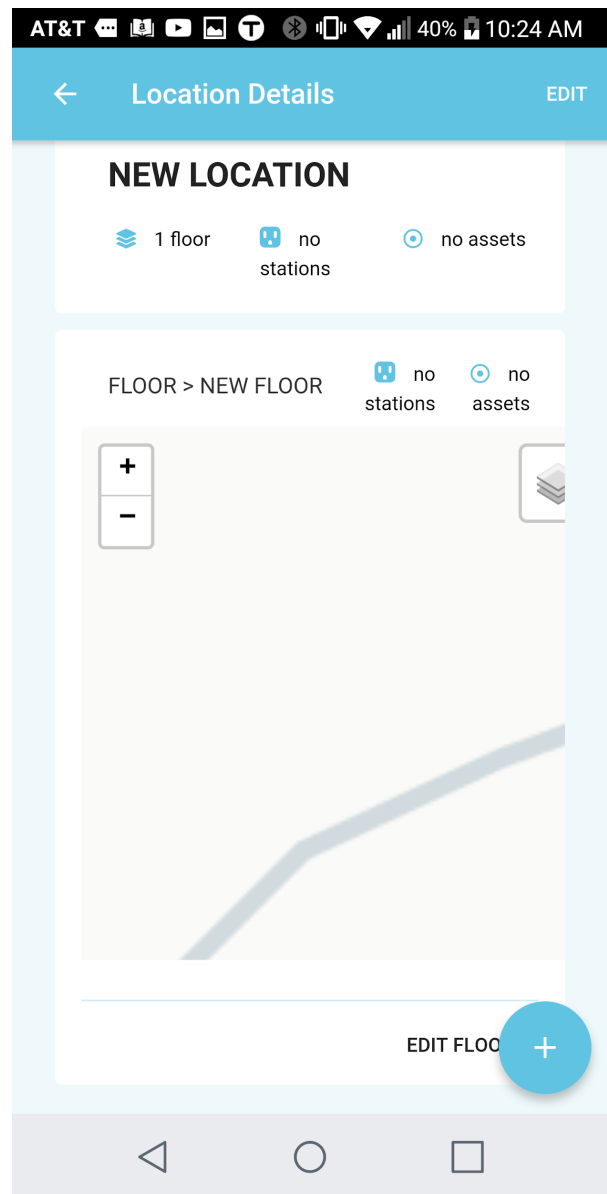
3. Click on the plus button on the bottom right hand side of the screen.

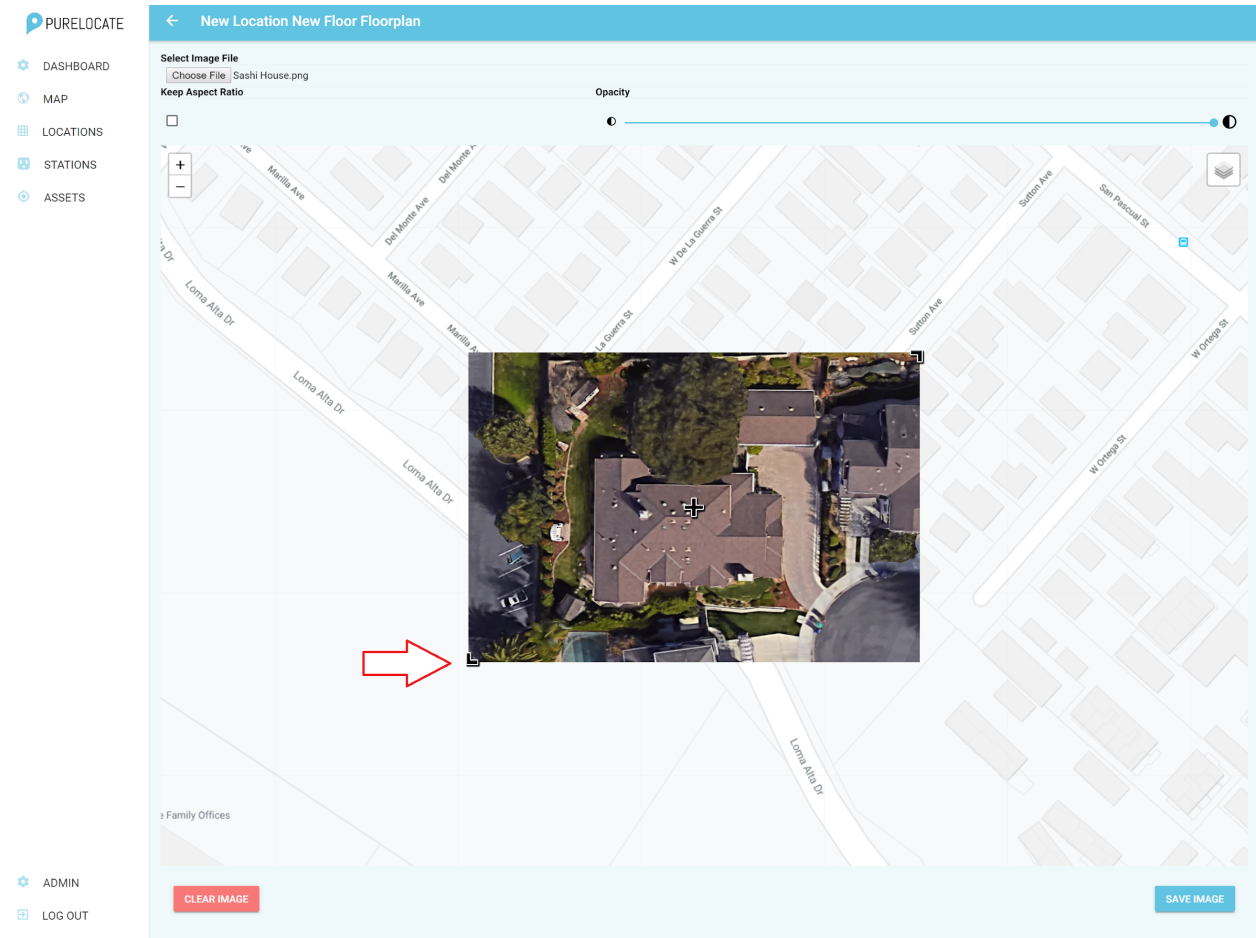


5. Click on the “Choose File” button, on the upper left-hand side. A file explorer will appear, allowing you to select a file your device/computer.

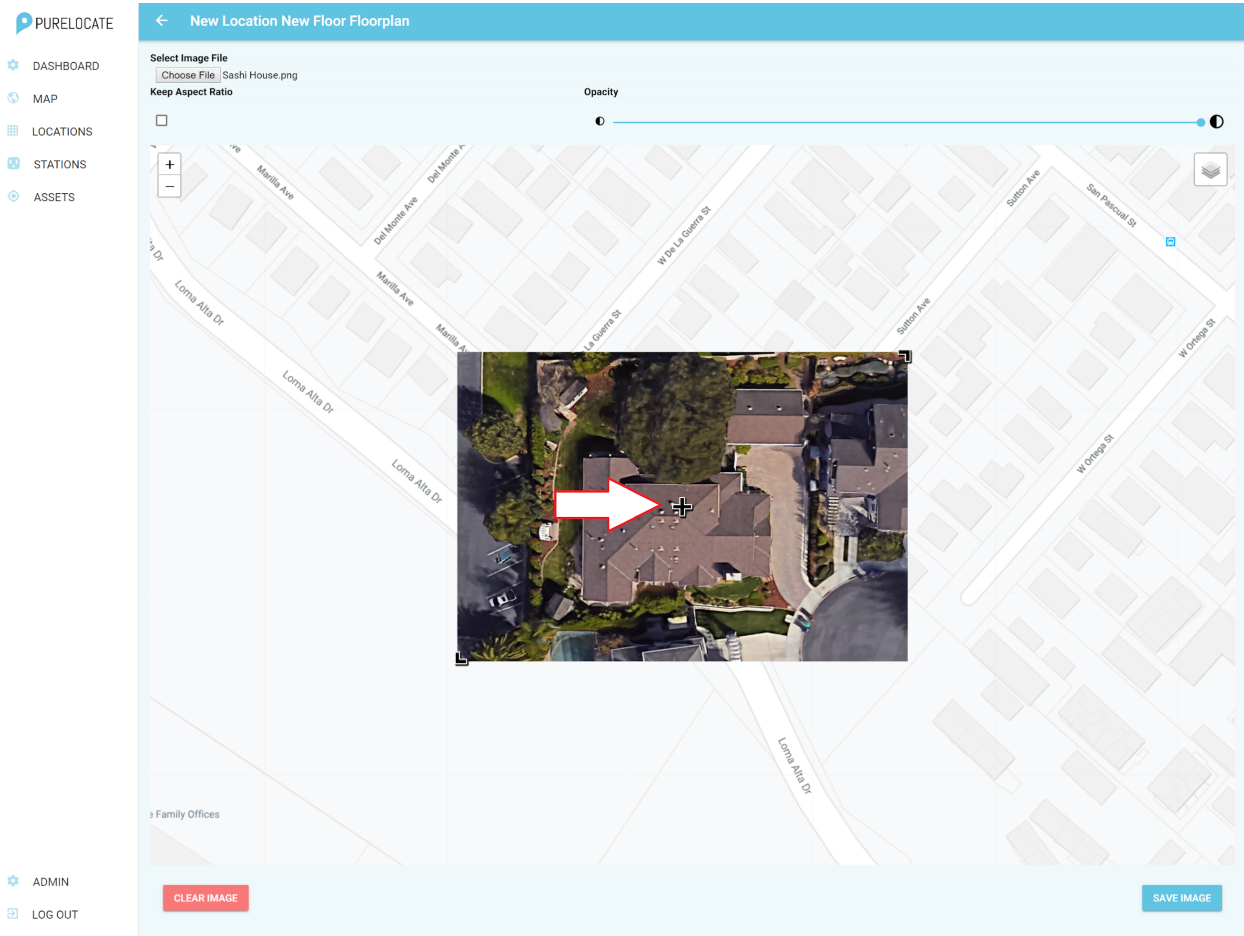

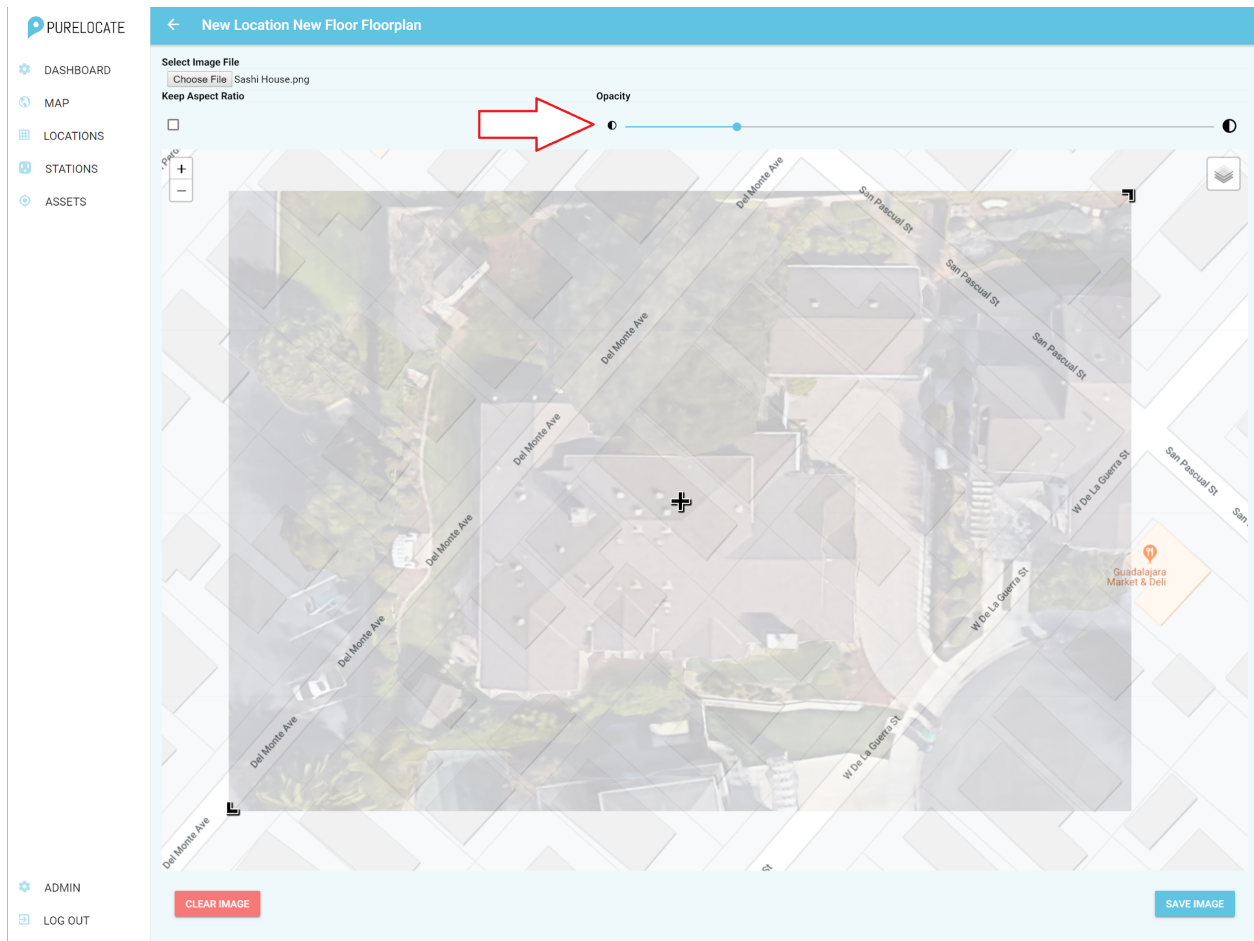
6. To resize the image, drag either the bottom left or upper right corner of the image.



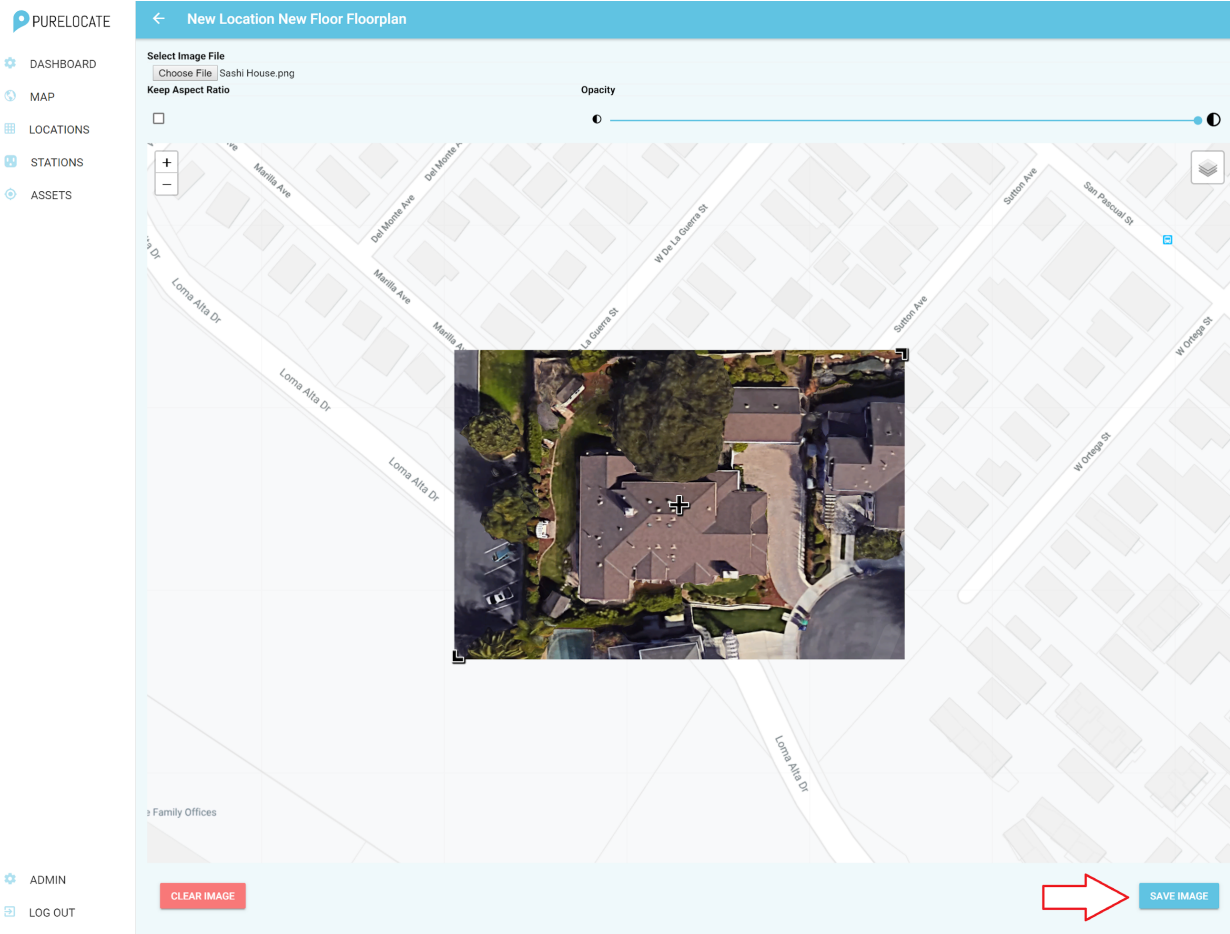
7. To drag the image around the map, hold left click on the center of the image.



8. To see the map behind the image, drag the opacity slider to the desired setting.

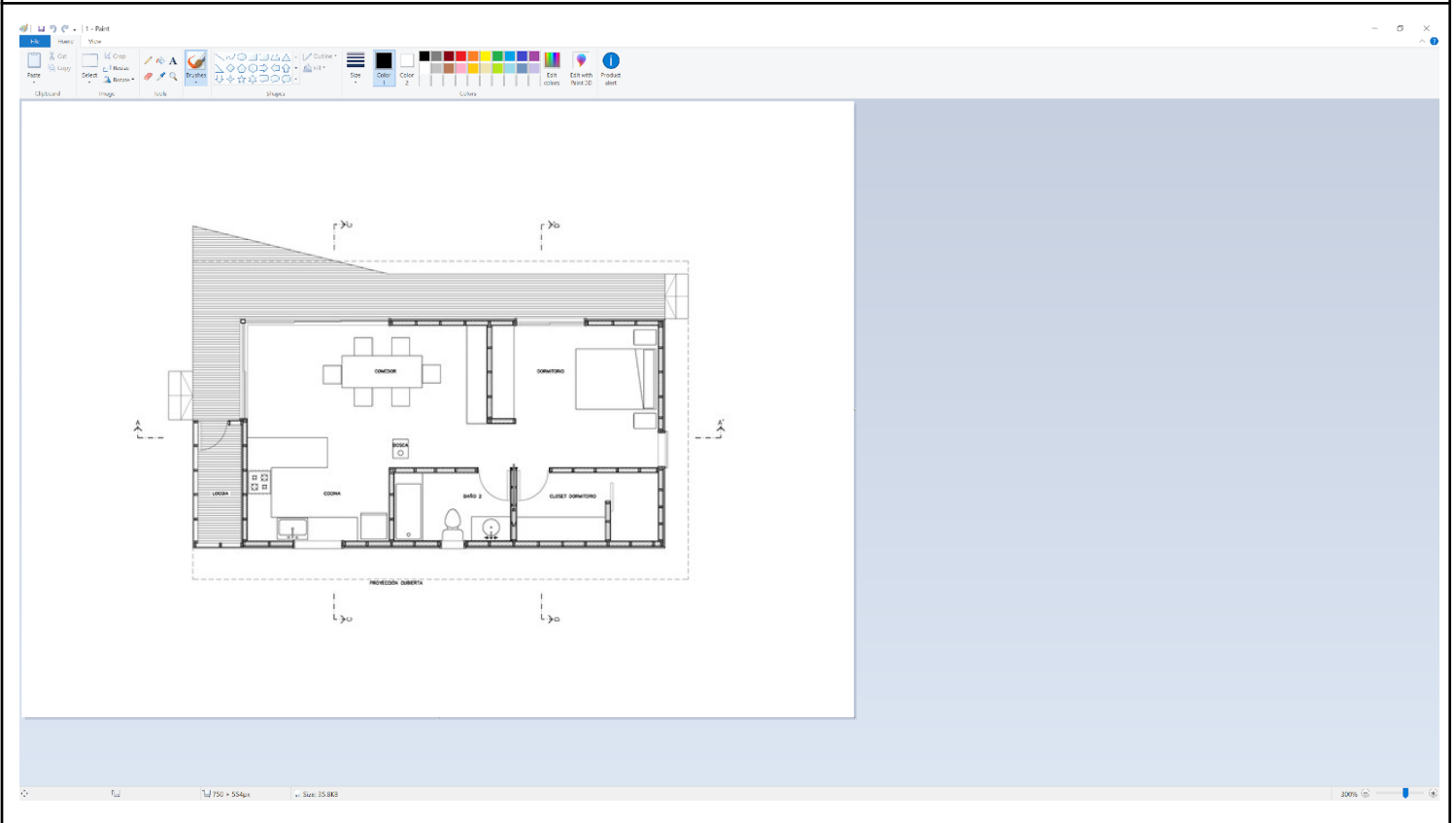


9. To finish, click on the “Save Image” button at the bottom right hand side.
