




At \$397 the Panasonic 42.5mm f1.7 isn't exactly a groundbreaking lens. But it does offer two extra features over the Olympus 45mm f1.8 new for \$399. First, it provides a slightly wider aperture of f1.7 compared to the f1.8 offered by olympus. However more importantly it offers "POWER O.I.S" image stabilization.

This was previously a feature reserved for the higher end Zoom lens like the Panasonic 70-200 and some higher priced primes like the \$1400 Nocticron 42.5mm f1.2.



Now we are seeing it in the new 42.5mm as well as the <u>Panasonic</u> 30mm f2.8 macro. Do you think this is a trend for panasonic to compete against Olympus's in camera stablization?



### Sony will stop producing CCD sensors

"Many in the industry had expected this to happen sooner or later," says Allied Vision CCO Michael Cyros. He notes that CMOS sensors have become increasingly popular over the past couple of years. "With greatly improved image quality, sensitivity, dynamic range and speeds, they have outpaced CCD technology of late," he says.

"Sony's decision is a logical step in that context to provide further capacity for CMOS growth."

Looking over the <u>list</u> of cameras that use Sony CCD sensors, it seems to be largely scientific and security camera applications. CCD sensors to suffer from rolling shutter, but now we have global shutter starting to pop up in some newer cameras like the blackmagic URSA and digital bolex.



## **<u>Litro moves to video</u>** (credit DPreview)

"Lytro CEO Jason Rosenthal has announced that the company has raised an additional \$50M in funding, but plans to use it to make a strategic shift into video and virtual reality, while shedding some jobs. Although the exact number of layoffs has yet to be decided, website re/code is reporting that between 25-50 of Lytro's 130-strong workforce may be made redundant as the company seeks to hire new employees with video and virtual reality experience. "


