The Church is a Community of Disciples

- In small groups make a powerpoint presentation or Google slides presentation of the four images of the Church you have studied to share with your school or parish or at a parent meeting.
- Invite each person in your class to write a decorated statement about how people of your age make Jesus visible in the world. Paint a large outline of Jesus and create a mural using this and the statements. You may like to make a movie of the people reading their statements to share.
- In small groups make human statues of people enacting actions of Christ visible in the world. Make groups together slowly using music such as “Christ has no body but mine” (St Teresa’s Prayer, Michael Mangan). Make a large Tableau and photograph it and put it on the school website or blog.
- Debate the pros and cons of the Church being a community or a collection of individuals. Relate your responses to why Jesus didn’t try to establish the Church on his own. Make statements that sum up the conclusion of the debate you reach by saying something like - This debate has helped us see why the Church is a...
- Write a class description of what it means for a Year 8 young person today to be a disciple of Jesus. Publish this in the school and parish newsletter.
