

September 2nd-5th: Students will read the folk-tale "Two Legs or One" in their literature book. This week, students will focus on the following skills: genre (specifically folktale), tone, exaggeration, and commas.

September 8th – 12th: Students will read two poems ("The Song of Wandering Aengus" and "Eldorado") and an excerpt of the novel *Monster*. Students will focus on the following skills: Mood, Sound Devices, Rhyme Scheme, Complex Sentences, Subordinating Conjunctions, and Analyzing Narrators.

September 15th – 19th: Students will read an excerpt from the graphic novel adaptation of *Monster* and complete a comparison between the excerpt of the novel and the excerpt of the graphic novel. Students will focus on Mood, Analyzing Graphic Novels, and Analyzing Narrators.

September 22 - October 3rd: Students will be completing their End of Unit tasks. The End of Unit test will be September 23-24, the End of Unit writing will begin September 25-26, and students will present their projects on October 2nd and 3rd.


