

BEHAVIOR PLAN

Rules: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe

Green: Very good behavior. Followed classroom rules with little to no reminders or disruptions.

Yellow: Behavior in need of improvement. Needed multiple reminders to follow rules or caused multiple disruptions.

Red: Unacceptable behavior. Specifics will be communicated to parent via note or phone call home.

Double Red: Behavior so disruptive or severe that they were sent to the office, along with a phone call home. Examples are biting, hitting, inappropriate language, defying the teacher, or stopping the class from functioning. **Double red behaviors may also constitute a behavior referral.**

If your child decides to break the rules, the following consequences may occur:

Yellow: A discussion with the teacher, and 5-10 minutes of reflection time at a separate desk. They may be asked to draw a picture or write a simple note about what rule they were breaking and what they can do to fix it.

Red: Student will have all of the above, and a phone call or message home. Messages will be sent in the behavior folder &/or on class dojo.

Double Red: All of the above, and an administrator will be called to the classroom to address the behavior.

I am looking forward to having your child in my class this year. The school year will be filled with many fun and rewarding experiences. In order to help them get the most out of each day, it is important that each student is able to learn in a positive environment. In order to provide this environment, I have developed a classroom behavior plan that will be in effect each day throughout the year. You will find the plan stapled to this sheet.

In your child's daily take home folder, you'll find a behavior sheet, which will be marked with whatever color your child's behavior earned that day. Please remember to initial this each and every day. This is very important.

Our Classroom Rules:

- 1. Be Respectful (be kind)**
- 2. Be Responsible (be ready to learn)**
- 3. Be Safe (do not hurt or harm others)**

In my class, following the rules comes with rewards. I believe that doing what is asked and expected should come with verbal celebrations and praise, but I also give small treats daily when I "catch" wanted behavior like following the rules, finishing work on time, meeting or exceeding expectations, being extra kind/helpful, etc. (Treats will be what is donated by you from our wish list, so they will get an m&m, gummy bear, or a skittle. Please send into school asap.) **Very good behavior all week will also earn them a sticker of their choice on Fridays. Very good behavior all month will earn them a prize from our treasure box.**

****I will explain the behavior plan to all students, and they will always be encouraged to strive for very good behavior. To help make the connection between school and home, please go over this plan with your child, and address yellow and red behaviors with clear expectations &/or consequences. Together, we can make this a great year for all of us!****
