Yes. I am now able to manage or at least stabilize patient that presents to me in the emergency room and prescribe necessary management for OPD cases.


What conclusions or changes have resulted?

Are there any other learning needs that I have discovered?


I should be more skilled in interpreting other ancillary diagnostics.
