Talking points

- We should all be there for our families when they need us most. But right now, too many Virginians worry about balancing work and family responsibilities when illness strikes. Currently, 55 percent of working adults in Virginia are either not eligible for or can't afford to take even unpaid leave. Paid family and medical leave would ensure that hardworking Virginians can take more than a few days away from work to care for themselves or a loved one when serious illness strikes or to welcome a new child.
- People of color have been hardest hit by both the pandemic and its economic effects. Gaps in access to job-protected **paid family and medical leave** and a livable wage mean people of color face greater hardships when health and family care needs arise.
- Paid family and medical leave is a cost-effective tool for public health and economic recovery and we can't afford not to act.

- Thousands of Virginians are forced to choose between staying in the
 workforce and ensuring their kids are cared for. By improving access to
 quality, affordable childcare we can ensure families have the tools they need
 to succeed at work while helping their kids thrive.
- Seniors and people with disabilities need access to affordable, reliable
 long-term care that centers the needs of patients without bankrupting
 families. This means investing in building a long-term care infrastructure that
 works for families and valuing the hard work of professional caregivers.
