Reading Comprehension- The Battle of the Ironclads (Iron Ships)

The Battle of the Ironclads is a true story from the time of the American Civil War. In 1861, the United States was fighting a big war between the states in the North and the ones in the South. President Lincoln led the Union Navy in the North. They used wooden ships to block the Southern ports.

The Southern Navy took an old wooden warship and covered it with thick iron armor plates. They named it the Virginia. On March 8, 1862, the Virginia steamed out and attacked President Lincoln's wooden Union ships. Its guns fired loudly while sailors worked hard below deck while wooden ships sank.

On March 9, a new iron ship from the North arrived. It was called the Monitor. The two metal ships fought each other for many hours. They fired cannon balls back and forth, but most shots bounced off. The sailors below deck on both ships kept the engines running.

This battle showed the world that metal ships with strong hulls were much better than old wooden ones. It helped change shipbuilding forever and led to stronger steel ships like the Titanic.
