


<b>LESSON TITLE:</b> Bessie Coleman's Dream Took Flight	<b>LESSON GOAL:</b> The students will learn about Bessie Coleman and her historical importance.

<b>DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:</b> (Check for Understanding)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Who taught Bessie about women pilots?</li> <li>• Why did Bessie have to go to France?</li> <li>• How did Bessie Coleman make her dreams come true?</li> </ul>
<b>SUPPLIES NEEDED:</b> Paper (3 sheets), metric ruler, masking tape, measuring tape, scissors, note paper	<b>ACTIVITY INTRODUCTION:</b> Read the introduction aloud to the students at the link below.

<b>GROUP GAME:</b> <u>Developmental Goal:</u> To improve hand-eye coordination and strategic play. <u>Equipment Needed:</u> 1 or 2 playground balls	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Read through the game instructions ahead of time so that you can teach the activity.</li> <li>2. Use an attention-getter to gather students and make sure they are listening.</li> <li>3. Explain the game, the rules, and how to play the game.</li> <li>4. Check for understanding, have a few kids and staff demonstrate play.</li> <li>5. Link to game: <a href="#">Bridge Ball</a></li> </ol>
