Voter Registration: In-person absentee voting will begin Oct. 12.

- 1. Registration can be done in person at the Lorain County Board of Elections office, located at 1985 North Ridge Road E., Sheffield Township
- 2. Online at <u>olvr.ohiosos.gov</u>
- 3. By mail, so long as it's postmarked by Oct. 11th.

Midview Substitute Levy Information, Issue 5:

What will new and current residents pay?

There was a recent question regarding what residents will pay, so I wanted to explain that the November 8 substitute levy will generate the same revenue from the property taxes paid by current homeowners as the 2012 and 2013 emergency levies. It's a fixed dollar amount—meaning there is no new tax for current residents. Because the district is expecting growth throughout the community in the form of new housing units, this substitute levy will allow the district to collect taxes on these new developments with no increase or change to current homeowners. *All taxpayers (new and existing homeowners) will pay the same rate.*

Substitute Levy Issue #5 Information

Midview Local Schools is intentional in how we make decisions regarding our budget. It is important to us that we are fiscally responsible so that we can invest in our students' success. We have taken many steps over the years to maintain fiscal responsibility, including consistently establishing, monitoring, and enforcing building/department budgets, maintaining business partnerships to fund various programs, routinely monitoring and evaluating staffing levels that meet student needs and seeking local, state and federal grants to fund programming and student experiences.







Presently, two emergency levies that generate \$6.2 million for the Midview Schools are set to expire at the end of 2023. The Board approved placing a \$6.2 million substitute levy on the November 8, 2022 ballot, that will act as a combined renewal for the two expiring emergency levies.

Issue 5 is **NOT A NEW TAX** on current residents. Because the district is expecting growth throughout the community in the form of new housing units, this substitute levy will allow the district to collect taxes on these new developments with no increase or change to current homeowners. All taxpayers (new and existing homeowners) will pay the same rate.


Veteran Sign Request Form



District Safety Program for Staff and Students: Run, Hide, Fight

With the 2022-2023 school year successfully underway, I wanted to send an update on our new safety and security protocol Run, Hide, Fight. While in the past our district has followed the ALICE protocol for responding to an emergency situation involving an intruder in a building, *Run*, *Hide*, *Fight* is the protocol used by the Lorain County Sheriff's department as well as other first responders in our area. As we know that the safety, security and well-being of our students and staff are a top priority for both our district and our community, we wanted to align our district protocols with the protocols used by our first responders.

Starting next week, principals will share information regarding their introduction of the basics of the Run, Hide, Fight protocol to students, and throughout the school year, students will learn how to respond to emergency situations using the Run, Hide, Fight protocol through practice scenarios.

Information will include:





<u>Reason:</u> Midview is moving away from the ALICE response to the Run, Hide, Fight model that is consistent with the Lorain County Sheriff's Department and first responders in our area. The model is similar to ALICE but is a more simplified approach.

<u>Run</u>	<u>Hide</u>	<u>Fight</u>
Leave your belongings behind	Lock doors	This is a last resort
Evacuate as quickly as possible	Use any heavy objects to block	Attack threats in their vital areas
Help others escape, if possible	the door	(eyes, nose, throat, head, groin)
Keep your hands visible	Tie off door knobs if able	Use anything to distract
Call 911 when you are safe	Move away from the door

The safety, security and well-being of our students and staff are a priority in Midview. We hope that our utilization of Run, Hide, Fight will help to further our commitment to safety and security both in our schools and in our community.

STOPit Anonymous Reporting Bullying/Violence/Self-Harm Reporting System:

As a reminder, Midview also utilizes the STOPit Anonymous Reporting System which serves as an important deterrent in preventing school violence. STOPit, an online and app-based system, allows students, parents, and community members to report potential safety concerns anonymously.
