I researched about the Aztecs empire and their civilization. The first thing I was interested about was how they wore clothing. The next thing was school. The last thing about my research was how they sacrificed their people for the gods.

The things that stood out in my research is that how you dressed was really important and there were rules. For example, only rich people could wear feathers and only the emperor could wear turquoise blue. Poor people had to make their own clothes. You got in a lot of trouble if you broke one of the rules about clothes and could even be killed for it.

School was important to the Aztecs, and they were taught by their parents until they were teenagers and then they would go to school. There were separate schools for boys and girls and they learned different things. Boys learned how to fight and girls learned how to cook, clean, and take care of a home.

I learned that they worshiped many gods and it was important for them to remember the dead and what they sacrificed and the holiday Day of the Dead came from there. Every 52 years the Xiuhmolpilli prevent the world from coming to an end. The completed year cycle was symbolically represented by stone sculptures (Xiuhmolpilli) which show a bundle of sticks tied at the ends with ropes and these sculptures were buried since the year cycle had died

Based on my search into the Aztec civilization is about the daily life of the Aztec people and what they ate and how they had to hunt for food and they ate like insects, honey, snakes, fish, and cocoa beans like some homeless people may live like the Aztecs civilization and a life lesson is to not be ungrateful or be rude to a worker or a waiter because there making food for you don't know what could of brought them to work there
