To me this is just as much as important as breathing or eating. And it is something we definitely need to learn as a community. - Simon Kiener

Sidsel:

I found myself sitting and talking with a young guy from Australia, who just happened to be in Bern that day. We talked about our countries, and for a long time it was just fascinating to fall deeply into the view and perspective of a teenage boy, which whom I typically would not end up talking with in this way. Afterwards it hit me, that I have 2 cousins, both teenage boys in just about the same age, and i have never ever had the time, space or the intention to have such a conversation with neither of them. This Käfele let me with the intention to cross more of the unconscious boundaries and distances that exists between humans whom are close to me. - Sidsel Andersen

Tamas:

There is something magical about the Käfele event in the Happy Bern Lab. People usually come in not knowing what to expect and leave with a satisfying feeling that they were able to do something that they usually don't do: talk to each other without an agenda or judgment.
