## **International Student Ministry in the Midst of COVID-19**

Chris Kauffman, Bridges Team Leader, Ohio State and Columbus State Campuses

Please share your thoughts and ideas about how to best minister to international students in light of higher education's response to COVID-19.

The comment section is arranged to provide an opportunity for you to share your ideas under the general themes of meeting felt needs, Win-Build-Send (evangelism, discipleship, and sharing the good news of Jesus beyond our campus), and identify specific target areas for ministry.

This document includes a collection of resources and brainstorming ideas that were shared by Cru campus ministry and Bridges International staff from throughout the US. Please take a moment to read through these ideas.

A. As dorms, classrooms, and campus building meeting space is not available through the end of the semester, what are the alternatives to these meetings and meeting spaces? What opportunities might be created for us to maintain our ministry community and continue to share the gospel?

#### Ø General Comments:

Security Concerns in Communicating w/Chinese Students: Please observe Wechat security guidelines, no spiritual convos or sharing gospel over Wechat. Ask for phone number and text/call them instead. Really ANY platform other than Wechat!! (insta, facetime, facebook, whatsapp are OK to use since we are in the US). (Mikayla K.)

# 1. What felt needs might international students have at this time and how might we meet them?

#### Ø General Comments:

- Loneliness, "cabin fever":
  - o Invite internationals to your home for dinner, maybe even a small group.
  - o Have a small group movie night
  - o Small group game night

. Challenges of Online Learning (Community Colleges): Many of the community college students we know have shared that they are not really that good on the computer, they could really use some tutoring help, learning how to log in, and complete assignments online. Many of these students are financially disadvantaged, consequently they do not have access to home internet to complete assignments. Our initial thought was that we could meet them at public libraries to use their free/high speed internet, but all public libraries are now closed for three weeks. *Solution*: we could ask a local church with internet access if we could host tutoring sessions in their fellowship hall, free parking, free access, benefits church partnership.

Campus Housing/Relocation Assistance: On our campus, as of 3/12/2020, all students will be moved out of dorms as of 3/23/2020. International students are required to stay in Columbus to maintain their proper immigration status. So students may need help locating short term housing, furnishing unfurnished apartments, and moving. For students in the dorms, that we know on a first name basis, we should offer to help them through this process, this may not be a great number of people, but I think we should offer to help them.

#### Maintaining community and social connectedness

- o **Phone a Friend:** Instead of meeting new students on campus with surveys and mobile mapping, take that time to call students who have been involved this semester. Just spend a few minutes checking in on them; ask how they are feeling and ask to pray with them. This doesn't have to be a scheduled or long conversation; but it is an easy way to communicate care and support.
- o **Start a book club** Tell students that you'll buy them a book on Amazon, and then meet a few times to chat about it. This could be a great way to launch

spiritual conversation and provide people with both entertainment + connection if they're bored.

- o **Take advantage of Social Media** host photo competitions on Instagram or Facebook to keep people engaged and entertained (ie. "caption this photo", "post a photo of your most creative Top Ramen meal", etc.)
- o **Targeted Ads/Facebook chat** A team in NAME is connecting with curious students using FB targeted ads and following up with the interested on FB chat.
- Instagram In Tokyo they are sharing the Gospel with thousands unfamiliar with the message
- Send a Fun Online Quiz a team in Slovakia is using a fun online quiz to form coaching relationships and share the Gospel

Ask about their family. Let them know you understand their feelings of sadness and helplessness as they are apart from their loved ones back home.

*Pray for them.* Pray that God would fill their hearts with His comfort and peace. Pray for His protection of their family from sickness. Pray they would turn their hearts towards God.

Share with them.
