A. Tables

Otherwise, they may be moved to the following page. If its size is less than the type area, it can be placed after references in a single column format and cited in text Table captions should be centered above the table.

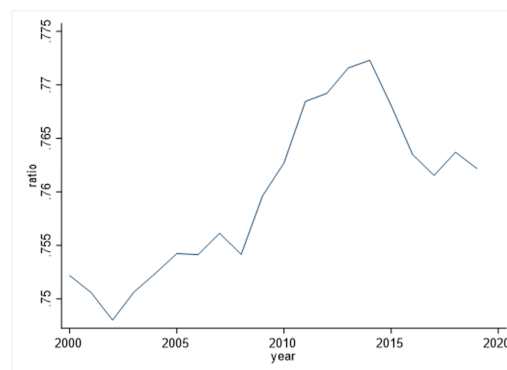


Figure 1 Line Chart ← (10 pt, Nirmala UI Semilight, Regular)
