Katherine S. Craver, 70, 514 Fulton St., Kingsport, died Tuesday morning (March 17, 1987) at Holston Valley Hospital & Medical Center.

Born in Knoxville, she had lived in Kingsport since 1965 and was a member of Holston Valley Unitarian Church.

Mrs. Craver was formerly employed as social services counselor for the Sullivan County Department of Human Services, retiring in 1981. She also was an active member of several organizations including the Kingsport Senior Citizens Club, having participated for several years in the Senior Citizens Olympics. She was scheduled to compete in the U.S. National Senior Olympics competition in St. Louis in June of this year.

Surviving are two sons, Sgt. Michael P. Craver, Barksdale AFB, Louisiana, and David T. Craver, Kingsport; a daughter, Mary Katherine Wilks, Ft. Stewart, Ga.; two grandchildren; three brothers, Robert M. Switzer, Kingsport, David W. Switzer, Sebring, Fla., and Richard E. Switzer, Knoxville; four sisters, Marger S. Bower's Asheville Softball Players Hurt in Wreck at Sylva

Ben Bower of Bower's, Inc., left this morning for Sylva, N. C., where five members of his Asheville softball teams were reported in a hospital suffering from injuries sustained when their bus overturned near there last night.

The bus, with 35 boys and girls of the two teams that played Goodall and the Blue Circle teams at Chilhowee Park yesterday afternoon, was returning to Asheville. The bus ran off the highway, and overturned, according to reports. None is thought seriously injured.

The more severely hurt were Joe Gentry, whose left ear was cut off; Charles Lominac who suffered a broken left shoulder; George

(Spud) Bryson, a broken finger on his right hand; and C. V. (Buster) Connolly, whose head cuts required 14 stitches.

Young Gentry's ear was sewed back by physicians at hospital on the hill in Sylva.

Others were taken to the hospital for treatment were Miss Hope McMillan, Miss Rosa Lena Hale and Bill Hearn. The two girls were left at the hospital. Mr. Hearn, after having eight stitches sewed in his forehead, continued to Asheville with the rest of the players.

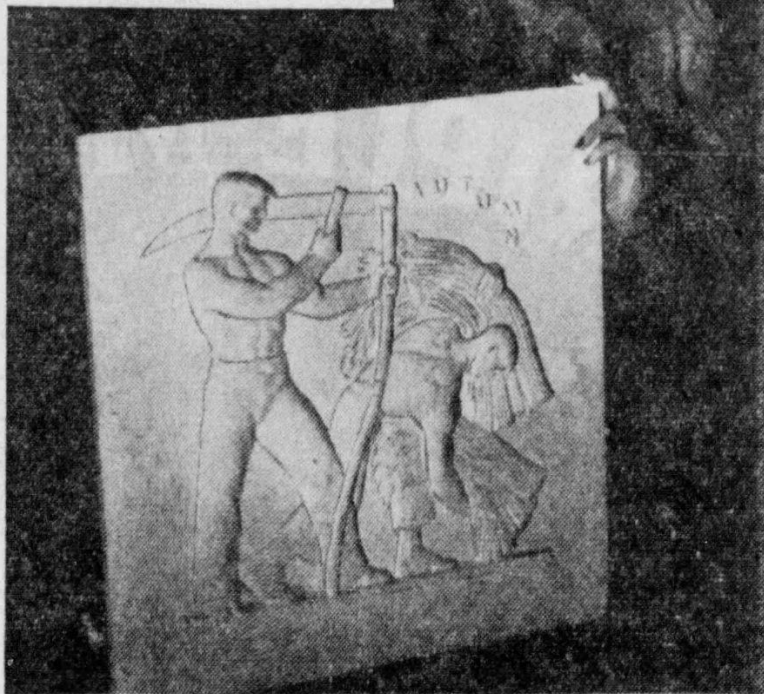
