
Evening Events

Public Transport

BUS

115 - Regular Service between Maynooth University and Dublin City Centre (approx every 30 minutes). This is often the quickest way to get to Dublin as it avoids other small towns. The 115 does not run late at night however.

C4 - Regular Service between Maynooth and Dublin City Centre (every 20 - 30 minutes at peak times). Can be slow, with many stops along the way - takes about an hour to and from the city centre.

C3 - Similar to C4

Both C3 and C4 run throughout the night - although less frequently.

Airport Hopper There is a direct bus between Maynooth and Dublin Airport. Booking in advance is advised. [<https://airporthopper.ie/>]. See next page for more details.

TRAIN

There is a regular train service during the day between Maynooth and Dublin. This generally takes about 45 minutes.

There are direct *Intercity* trains between Sligo and Dublin which take about 30 minutes (Dublin ↔ Maynooth) - there are only a few of these per day.

Train services do **not** run between about 23:20 and 05:30 - please check the timetable.

Transport from Dublin Airport


Airport Hopper BUS

- The easiest way to get between Maynooth and Dublin Airport. [<https://airporthopper.ie/>]
- Airport → Maynooth: Buses leave DAA Coach Park Zone 16 every hour from 04:50 to 20:50.
- Maynooth → Airport: Buses leave from near the train station every hour from 04:00 to 21:00.
- Trips usually take about 45-55 minutes.
- It is advised to book tickets in advance.

Alternative routes

Other public transport options are to take a bus into Dublin City and then take a train or bus. If the bus goes past Drumcondra train station it can be possible to get a train connection from there. Google maps will tell you if there is a convenient connection.



TICKETS

Public transport tickets can be bought at train stations or on the bus. However Dublin bus does **not** offer contactless payments and still requires cash. A much more convenient option is to use a prepaid Leap card - [<https://about.leapcard.ie/dublin>] which can be purchased at most newsagents. In Dublin airport these can be obtained at :
