

Psychological Study on the Differences Between Problematic MMORPG Gaming and High MMORPG Engagement

Many players spend significant amounts of time playing video games. Some of these players experience problems as a result of their gaming while others do not. The purpose of this study is to increase our understanding of the psychological differences between those who present with problematic gaming and those who can spend significant amounts of time gaming yet do not experience any problems as a result. These differences can be used to inform treatments and assessments for problematic gaming, as well as shape problematic gaming research.

METHODS. To explore these differences, we will be administering online surveys at two different time points.

The first survey will be open from May to July of 2023 and the second survey will be open from January to March of 2024. Note that, to complete the second survey, participants must have completed the first survey. The second survey is designed to be a follow-up to see how things have changed after approximately 6 months.

Both surveys will take up to 40 minutes each to complete. Both surveys will ask about your...

- gaming experiences
- gaming motivations and attitudes
- engagement in other activities outside of gaming
- psychological wellbeing
