



Washington is 1 of only 5 states where local communities can't pass their own commercial tobacco regulations due to preemption laws. This means local leaders are barred from enacting policies to protect youth from nicotine addiction and counter the tobacco industry's harmful tactics. Preemption creates barriers to health equity, preventing communities from addressing their specific challenges. Local leaders and residents know what's best for their towns and cities—they should have the power to act.
