### **NJCL Convention**

### What?

NJCL Convention is a unique opportunity to meet with over 1,600 Latin students from across the country while staying on a college campus during a week of fun Latin-related activities and competitions! ### When and where?

The 2018 NJCL Convention will take place July 23-28 at Miami University in Oxford, OH.

### How do I sign up?

All Indiana attendees must register with the state via this Google Form before registering on the NJCL site and pay the \$30 state fee (this fee is included in the cost of the optional IJCL Bus Trip).

### How much does it cost?

The cost of convention is \$495 plus \$60 for the Sunday night stay (\$555 total). If you choose to take advantage of the IJCL Bus Trip to NJCL Convention, there will be an additional cost associated with that (more information below).

### How do I get there?

JCL members have three options to get to NJCL Convention:

- participate in the IJCL Bus Trip
- ride with their parents
- ride with their sponsor

We encourage all delegates to join the IJCL Bus Trip so they are able to enjoy the fun activities and group bonding that happens along the way!

### What other dates should I remember?

- July 6-7 Certamen Boot Camp at Crown Point High School (if selected as a member of the state Certamen team)
- July 7 State Picnic in Crown Point for Hoosiers attending NJCL Convention (12 p.m. CST, 1 p.m. EST)
- July 20 IJCL Bus Trip departs from Indianapolis around 12 p.m.
- July 28 IJCL Bus Trip returns to Indianapolis around mid-afternoon

# **NJCL Convention Bus Trip**

Are you planning to attend the 2018 NJCL Convention? We encourage all delegates to join the IJCL Bus Trip to experience the group bonding that helps create lifelong friendships and a competitive, unified state delegation. You will enjoy much of what Cincinnati has to offer before you arrive at Miami University in Oxford, OH, where you will join 1,600 other Latin students at the 65th Annual NJCL Convention. The cost of the IJCL Bus Trip includes the \$30 state fee.

The IJCL Bus Trip includes visits to the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden, Spring Grove Cemetery & Arboretum, Cincinnati Art Museum, Cincinnati Walking Tour, Newport Aquarium, Kings Island, Pyramid Hill Sculpture Park, and Jungle Jim's International Market as well as a riverboat cruise with lunch included.

The full cost for the IJCL Bus Trip is \$500 (not including convention), but see the informational packet for available discounts for early payments. The last discount will be available until May 1, so make sure you act fast!

### **National Convention First-Place Grants**

Did you earn first place in a contest at this year's State Convention? You should consider coming to NJCL Convention and competing in that same contest! If you apply for this grant, you can receive a portion of the money collected at "That's Entertainment" from this year's State Convention. The application form is available online <a href="here">here</a>; this application is due by May 15, and grants will be distributed in June. Remember, you need to register for NJCL Convention in advance since payment is due before you receive the grant from the IJCL.

### **Indiana Certamen Teams at NJCL Convention**

Complete this form by May 15 to indicate your interest in competing on the Indiana Certamen teams at NJCL Convention. Tryouts and the first practice will take place at Culver Academies on Saturday, June 9. (State Certamen winners can automatically claim a spot on the 8-person state team, but you must still complete the form by May 15 to claim your spot.) A Certamen "boot camp" will be held at Crown Point High School on Friday, July 6, and Saturday, July 7.
