As an Element of Art, *form* connotes something that is three-dimensional and encloses volume, having length, width, and height, versus *shape*, which is two-dimensional, or flat. A form is a shape in three dimensions, and, like shapes, can be geometric or organic. Line, color and texture can be used to create the illusion of form. She showed many examples from her collection.

    - i. Colors: off-white, gray, aqua, indigo, brown bold colors.
      - ii. Techniques: optical illusion, transparency, painting, dyeing, shibori, surface design, use of words, social issues, curves, paper piecing, boro stitching, Mid-century Mod, OpArt, graphic.
    - iii. Fabrics: linen,
      - iiii. Quilting: far less free-motion, mostly straight-line but not matchstick, hand/machine quilting, variegated thread

- i. Entries from 21 countries, 49 states in the USA. \$20,000 was awarded in prizes. A high percentage of winners were from International.
