The following competency areas have been identified as attributes employers seek in entry-level candidates*. Developing these eight Career Readiness skills will prepare you to thrive as you launch your career journey

Communication

Show understanding of the audience's diverse needs in order to exchange thoughts and ideas clearly and effectively in written, verbal, and non-verbal forms.

Critical Thinking

Identify and respond to needs based upon an understanding of situational context and logical analysis of relevant information.

Equity and Inclusion

Demonstrate the awareness, attitude, knowledge, and skills to equitably engage people from diverse cultures. Engage in anti-oppressive practices that challenge systems, structures, and policies of inequity.

Leadership

Draw upon interpersonal and organizational skills to motivate and develop others to achieve common goals. Recognize and capitalize on personal and team strengths to drive organizational success.

Professionalism

Knowing work environments differ greatly, understand and demonstrate effective work habits, and act in the interest of the larger community and workplace.

Self and Career Development

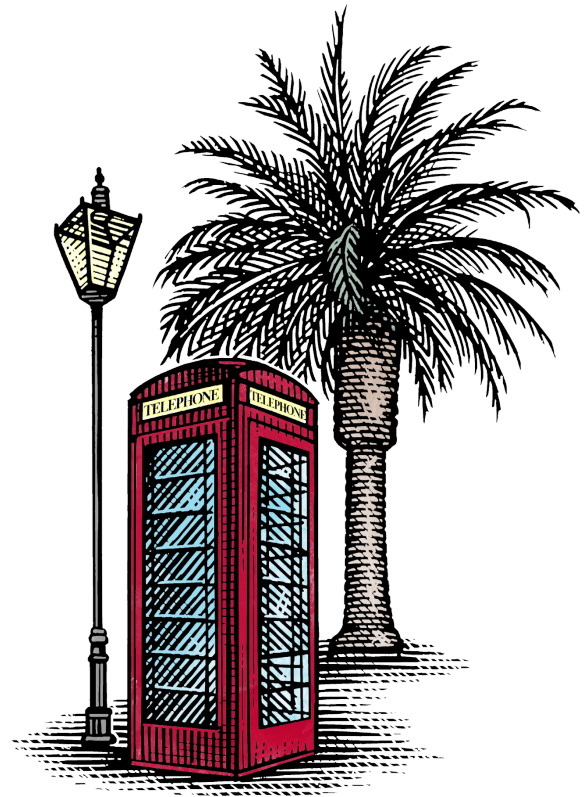
Proactively grow through personal and professional learning, awareness of strengths and weaknesses, navigation of career opportunities, and networking to build relationships.

Teamwork

Build and maintain collaborative relationships to work effectively toward common goals, while appreciating diverse viewpoints and shared responsibilities.
