Hilda Moreno was the daughter of a peach farmer and labor contractor in Stanislaus County, California. Hilda was on born on July 26, 1959 in Mexico and moved to the California Central Valley at an early age. Hilda had a tremendous work ethic. From an early age Hilda valued hard work. She helped her family work the orchards throughout the seasons. From irrigating and pruning, to harvesting, picking and grading, Hilda did it all. She even drove the semi-truck loaded with peach bins to be processed. Hilda was never afraid to get her hands dirty.
