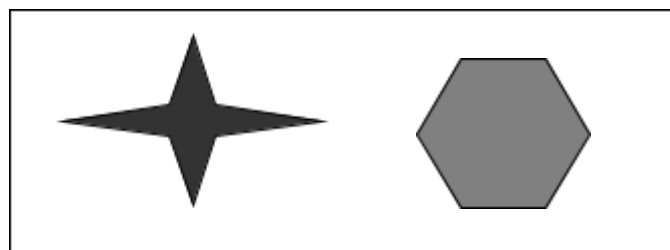


Figure 1: Captions for figures should be below the figure [Caption: Calibri 12pt. Centered]

#### IMPORTANT NOTES:

Manuscripts should present original research contributions and will be refereed. Manuscripts must be submitted electronically via the Open Journal System of **LINGKAR: Journal of Environmental Engineering submission** web page. Manuscripts can only be accepted in Microsoft Word. Authors should ensure that their manuscripts are printable on a standard Postscript printer. Charts and graphs should not rely on color for clear interpretation since printing will be black and white only.

Paper length is limited to 20 pages (including all figures, tables, bibliography and appendices). Authors should follow the format decided by **LINGKAR: Journal of Environmental Engineering**. Manuscripts should be in one-column page with a font size of 12 points using Calibri type for text and Calibri for title, author information, and main section headings. Manuscripts should be formatted for A4 paper. Top, bottom, and side margins should be 3 centimeters.

Paper style should follow the forms given in **the 16<sup>th</sup> Chicago Publication Manual**. In general, the background and purpose of the study should be stated first, followed by details of the methods, materials, procedures, and equipment used. Findings, discussion and conclusions should follow in that order.
