Scholarships will be awarded to students of Polish-American descent who are Rhode Island residents or who belong to a Rhode Island Polish-American organization, and are U.S. citizens. All of the above must be received by this date.

Announcement of the awards shall be made by March 14, 2025. The scholarship money shall be forwarded after September 1 to the student's college, upon confirmation of enrollment for the fall semester.

Follow the same notation style to quote reference sources and citations as you do for your high school research essays, i.e. adhere to all aspects of MLA format, including proper heading, parenthetical notation and a Works Cited page
- Be prepared to read/ present your essay at the Awards Ceremony if you are one of the recipients

RIPSF Essay Topic for 2025

With the 2024 Summer Olympics in the history books and the Winter Olympics scheduled for 2026, this year's essay topic focuses on **Americans of Polish Heritage and their participation in sports**. From pickup games on the local playground to high school and college teams, to club sponsored leagues, to Olympic tryouts, and to amateur and professional teams, Polish Americans have participated in practically every recognized sporting venue. In the late 19th and early 20th century Polish immigrants and their children found participation in sports as a way to overcome social barriers of the time. With determination and dedication athletes of Polish descent continue to prove their athletic ability.

Besides the more easily recognizable names such as Rob Gronkowski (New England Patriots) and Mike Krzyzewski (Duke University basketball coach), there is an extensive roster of Polish American athletes each with an interesting story. Some of those inducted into the National Polish American Sports Hall of Fame (NPASHF) include:

- Elaine Zayak, figure skating, after recovering from a serious foot injury when she was two years old went on to win a silver medal in the 1981 World Championship
- Allison Mleczko, hockey, Captain of the Women's Hockey Team at Harvard University and a 1998 Olympic Gold Medalist
- Tony Adamowicz, motor sports, winner of the US Formula Revival Championship 2009, 2011, 2012, and 2014
- Tony Zale, boxing, World Middleweight Boxing Champion, 1940 and 1948

In your own words, write a thoughtful and coherent essay by briefly discussing one athlete of Polish American heritage (either from above or one of your choosing). Ensure you follow the instructions to compose your essay and address each of these 6 bullet points:

2. Summarize the goals the athlete achieved and recognition attained in their sport
3. Discuss obstacles or setbacks the athlete had to overcome to reach their goal
4. Describe what you admire about the athlete you selected
5. (Optional) Not everyone can engage in philanthropy, but has this athlete given
back to the community through charitable efforts, paid it forward, during or after
their career? If so, tell us about it and what was their overarching goal
6. Discuss how this athlete's achievements can motivate you to do your best at
whatever you set out to do
