# The "Bronze" Badge

## **Lesson Objective**

In order to fly cross-country flights in any club aircraft, the club rules dictate that the candidate must have a sign-off for that cross-country flight. A bronze badge meets many of the requirements, and demonstrates the candidates skills necessary from safe cross-country flight.
