## How To Write The Intro To Your Essay

- 1. You need an opening hook
  - analogy: compare your topic's situation to another, making the connection between the two.
  - logos: use stats or data to impress your reader
  - emotional appeal: draw in your reader by making them feel angry, or sad
  - rhetorical question
- 2. State your opinion. Be direct and assertive!
- 3. Avoid using...
  - "I" or any form of it (my, mine, our, etc.)
  - I think, I believe, in my opinion, etc.
  - the Really Bad Words (remember those?)
- 4. State your main arguments, beginning with your best reason first, then second, then third (or whatever order you wish to use).
- 5. Remember, your intro paragraph is the road map to your essay; it tells the reader where this essay will be going.
