
EXPANDED RULES OF THE SUBREDDIT

In addition to site-wide rules we also observe the following rules. We do not expect anyone to observe the rules thoroughly before posting but once informed please abide.

If you violate these rules you will first receive a warning, upon a second instance or very serious infraction it incurs a short ban. Any violation of site-wide rules can receive a permanent ban without warning.

1. KEEP CONTENT RELEVANT TO WFRP+.

Posts should relate to WFRP or adjacent topics. These include similar settings and historical research, game systems used for WFRP, or wider topics that significantly relate WFRP. Where it does not directly relate to WFRP please connect it through discussion of the topic. Some exceptions may be allowed, such as for creative writing, but this should not be a habit.

We affirm that third-party game systems and settings have their place on this subreddit. Please note they are not affiliated in any way with WFRP or Games Workshop.

2. ADHERE TO CURATION STANDARDS.

Posts are held for approval so they can meet standards set out further on the wiki and maintain a good level of quality in their submissions, that is engaging to other members of the subreddit. Be clear and descriptive in title and content, make use of formatting, select a flair, and tailor content to Reddit's style.

Moderators may suggest or require some improvements. Communicating with moderators on posts is encouraged, and lets us know you understand. If your posts do not require moderation you can be added to Approved Submitters, which means there is no delay.

There are specific limitations on types of posts, such as LFG, set out further in Minor Regulations.

3. NO FIGHTING OVER GAME SYSTEMS.

There is explicitly no rudeness allowed in the discussion over game systems. You should remain polite and constructive, and may never make personal attacks. If you cannot remain calm and have nothing useful to say, avoid the topic.

4. PIRACY AND COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT IS NOT ALLOWED.

We fully prohibit piracy and copyright infringement of all official and third-party material. When sharing extracts please be respectful and limit only to what is necessary. Do not use other's work, text and art, in your own except without explicit permission, and you may be asked to change or remove content if it violates this rule. In addition, solicitation of links for the purpose of acquiring pirated material is also prohibited.

Without this rule and its enforcement, Cubicle 7 are not allowed to engage with the subreddit and the subreddit may be taken down.

CURATION STANDARDS

When making a post the following minimum requirements are expected of you. Failing to meet too many standards and we will ask you to remake your post. If you clearly understand these rules you may be made an Approved Submitter, you must still follow these standards.

- If you wish to discuss or share content in languages other than English please note this in the title, preferably in the following format: “[FR]” for French. We highly encourage bilingual posts.
- You must choose an appropriate Link Flair when posting, note that a moderator may alter this if they feel something else is more appropriate.
- The main point of the post should not be AI-Art. If you want to share a homebrew adventure, where you used some AI-Art to spice it up, that’s fine, but if it’s an image post with AI-Art it will not get approved. This decision was made by the community:

- Regarding post formatting in general:
 - Titles should be clear and descriptive, typically full sentences, such that you understand the basics of a post before viewing it. Avoid generic titles and make your title unique to the post.
 - When relevant, clearly state the game system and edition you are using in the title. If using an alternate, or significantly modified setting, please also state this.
 - You should make use of basic formatting available with Reddit, such as paragraphs, italics & bolding, and lists in order to keep large posts legible.
 - When linking to other people’s work, such as artwork, please clearly credit that person in the title and optionally as a comment.
- Please, when possible, provide context for your situation. It is more interesting for those reading and can improve the quality of response.
- Additionally you should respond to those offering help and engage with them with further discussion or simply just to thank them. You should be offering something back to those helping.
- If your post is a link the title may be that of the source, such as a blogpost or video title, but you should provide context for it as a comment. Please directly link over placing a link in the description, unless you have significant context to add.
 - You should avoid posting Blog entries from the same Blog more than once a week. If you make frequent posts please collate these links into a single post.
 - You may be asked to make a ‘context comment’ to explain a post as a comment, if you have made a Link Post.

- Regarding General Query posts, these are currently directed to pinned megathreads. If you make a General Query post you will be directed to this megathread. For what is considered a General Query see the Link Flair section.
- Regarding Actualplay posts;
 - You may not post your own Actualplay more than once a calendar week, or sooner than 4 days since the last. If you wish to share more often in a week please combine these into a single post.
 - If you wish to announce streams in advance please Message the Moderators to ask for permission, it may be approved for significant events from established members.
 - Youtube Streams may be announced in advance, though their titles should only briefly note the livestream announcement. Otherwise only VODs, such as for Twitch, are regularly allowed.
- Regarding Looking For Game posts may be removed after 1 week and you may be asked to include the following information clearly formatted and suitable context, example information given:
 - System: 4th Edition
 - Timezone: European Central Time (France)
 - Available: Mon/Wed/Thu after 3pm
 - Status: Player
 - Format: Discord/Roll20
 - Language: English
 - You also may not post the same Looking For Game post more than once every two calendar weeks, or sooner than 10 days since the last.
- Regarding Third Party posts, aka Commercial Work:
 - Commercial work must be verified as relevant by a moderator and depending on its relevancy may be permitted one-time advertisement, though may be shared again by regular users.
 - If considered relevant you may not post your own commercial work more than once a week, and when regarding sales and other promotions you should remove or edit the post when these end.
 - Commercial work is not differentiated from standard posts and must abide by the Curations Standards, and you should tailor your post to our community.
- Any information regarding 4th Edition should have a primary source, and should nearly always come from Cubicle7 themselves.
- If you're sharing generic Warhammer content and have already shared it on a large amount of subreddits your post may be rejected as 'well covered' already.
- Age of Sigmar RPG content should be posted on [/r/AgeOfSigmarRPG](#).
- Zweihander RPG content should be posted on [/r/grimandperilous](#), unless set in the Old World.

LINK FLAIR

Link Flairs are used to categorise and break up the content on the subreddit. When you make a post a moderator will choose a flair for you if you haven't already, or may change it if they feel something else is more appropriate. The current flairs are:

Roleplaying: for posts talking about elements of the game related to players or from the player's perspective; discussing how they act in the game, their character, and any creative ideas you want to discuss related to how and what you roleplay as.

Third Party: for discussing any third party system to use to roleplay in the Old World. We allow the one-time promotion of third party material inspired by WFRP, such as similar settings, but otherwise should be brought up by regular users.

Lore & Art: for posts talking about elements of the setting's lore or for showing off art and media relevant to the setting or the historical period. This relevancy should be discussed as part of the post, or should be directly relevant i.e battlemaps.

Homebrew: for sharing content that you've made yourself; adventures, lore, art, and more. Can include asking for feedback or resources during early creation. If it's something new then you can call it homebrew. This does not usually include house-ruling, which comes under Game Mastering or Discussion.

General Query: for small and quick questions that are a little too hard just to google, most commonly rules questions. These posts, if not directed to a megathread, may be removed after the question is answered if it isn't deemed to have any more use.

Game Mastering: for posts from the perspective of the Game Master; talking about the act of running the game, whether you're sharing your own experiences or more often asking a question about an issue you're having and how to improve.

Actualplay: for posts directly on playing the game, whether they're videos of you playing or writing on them after the fact. If this writing is from a player's perspective it is regarded as Roleplaying.

Looking For Game: for posts advertising the fact that you are either looking to join a game or are hosting one and want players to join on. Check the Curation Standards for what requirements there are when making these posts.

Discussion: for posts that aren't particularly focused on other categories, and instead are more generally "discussive" in quality. Blog posts in particular fit in here.

Announcement: for news relating to the hobby, whether it comes from Gamesworkshop, Cubicle7, or any other important source. This usually should be on official news, but occasionally may be about fan events. This does not include stream announcements.

Meta: for posts discussing the running of the subreddit, whether it's a mod documenting changes to rules or someone commenting on its running with criticism or praise.

Tomfoolery: for posts about memes, jokes, or other silly topics.

USER FLAIR

User Flairs are for you to show off a bit of specific personality on this subreddit! They are available in a wide variety of colours and may say anything you like in them provided they aren't too obscene, have some common sense.

If you'd like to select a User Flair go to the sidebar on the right, and look for an unticked box next to "Show my flair on this subreddit". Tick the box and select the "edit" next to your username and you can pick out a flair of your choosing, edit the text, and press save to submit it.
