

### **Course Overview:**

This year in Language Arts we will work on reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills addressing the Language Arts Florida Standards (LAFS). We will focus on close reading strategies, analyzing fiction and non-fiction texts, citing evidence to support ideas, essay format and writing practice, expanding vocabulary and grammar knowledge, and building creative and critical thinking skills. We will accomplish this through the use of the Collections textbook and Close Reader workbook and through various classroom activities including vocabulary enrichment, creative writing, and essay writing. Note taking will be taught and practiced as well as research skills. Technology will be used extensively throughout the year.

#### Grading:

Class grading will be done using a points system. The assignments will therefore carry different weights. Points will be determined based on time, energy, and knowledge base/content mastery needed to complete each assignment.

Bell ringers, Exit tickets, Quick writes, Participation 10 - 25 points
Classwork, Quizzes, Writing assignments 25 - 100 points
Projects, Tests, Essays 100 - 200 points

The following is the grading scale - 90% - 100% A 80% - 89% B

70% - 79% C 60% - 69% D 59% and below F

Updated grades will be posted in Focus each week and students will be directed to check grades and assignments on a regular basis.

Late Work Policy: Students are expected to turn in work as assigned on time. They can view all assignments in the Google classroom including due dates. Work will be accepted if turned in late, but partial credit may be given depending on the lateness, quality, and completeness of the assignment. If any work is turned in late to the teacher, it is the student's responsibility to notify the teacher that the work has been completed and turned in late. Makeup Work Policy: Should a student miss class, it is the responsibility of the student to find out what work and assignments were missed and make them up.
