

**Step 0:** Download the Hypothes.is Custom Tags extension!

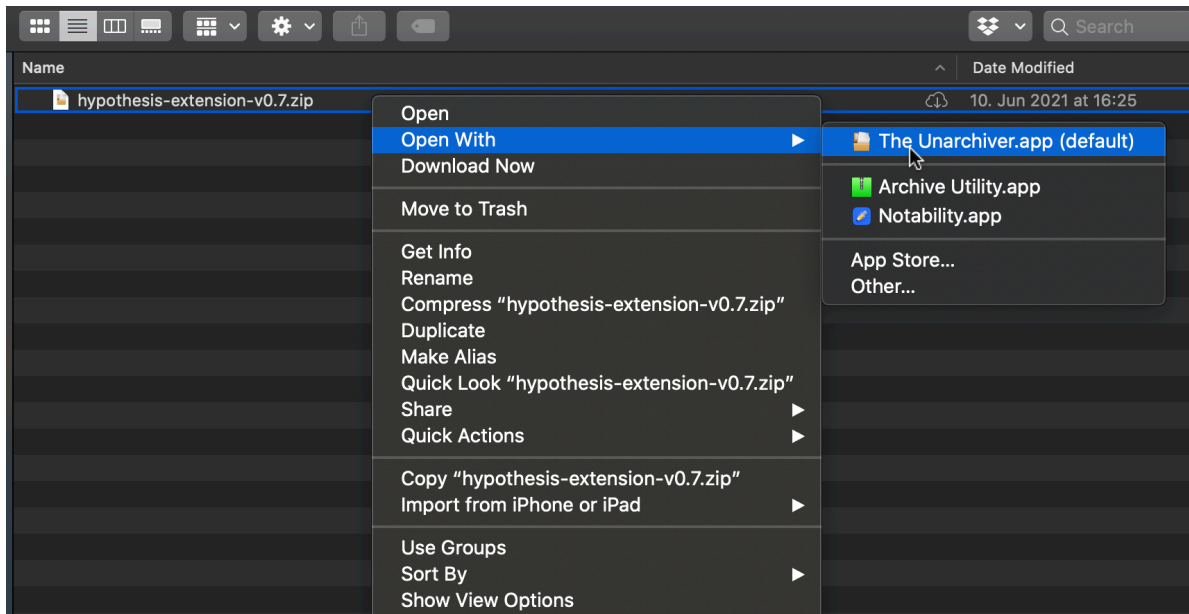



Download the .zip archive for our version of Hypothes.is here:

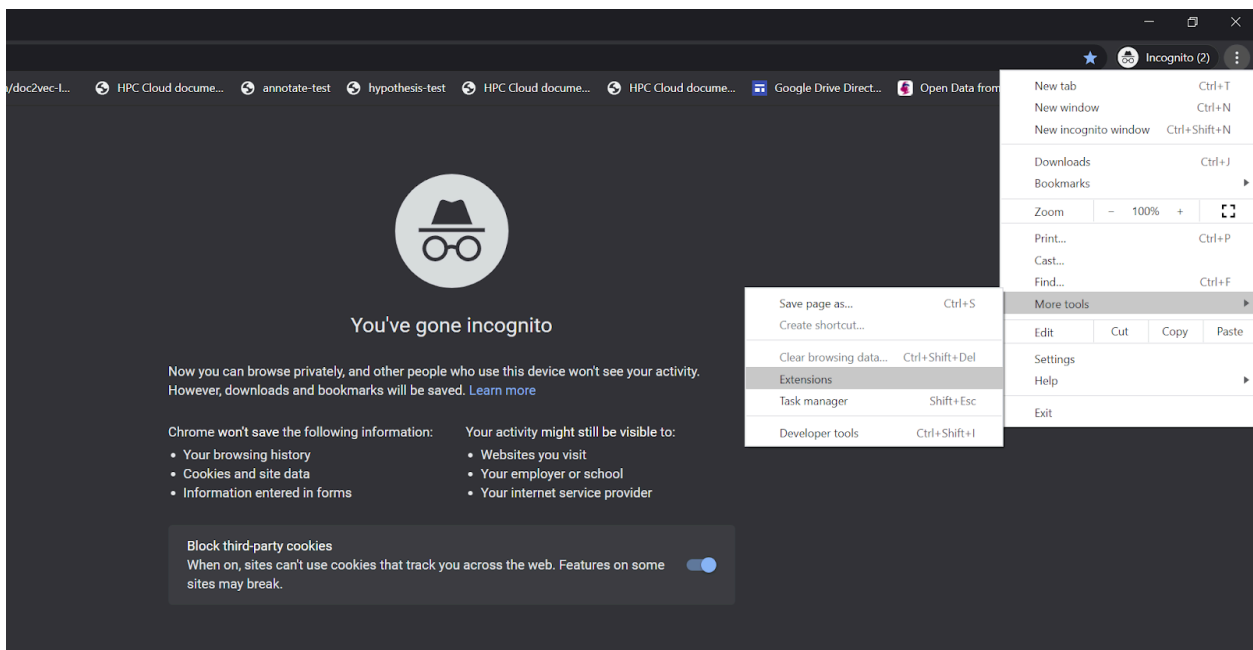

**Then follow Steps 1 - 6 below:**

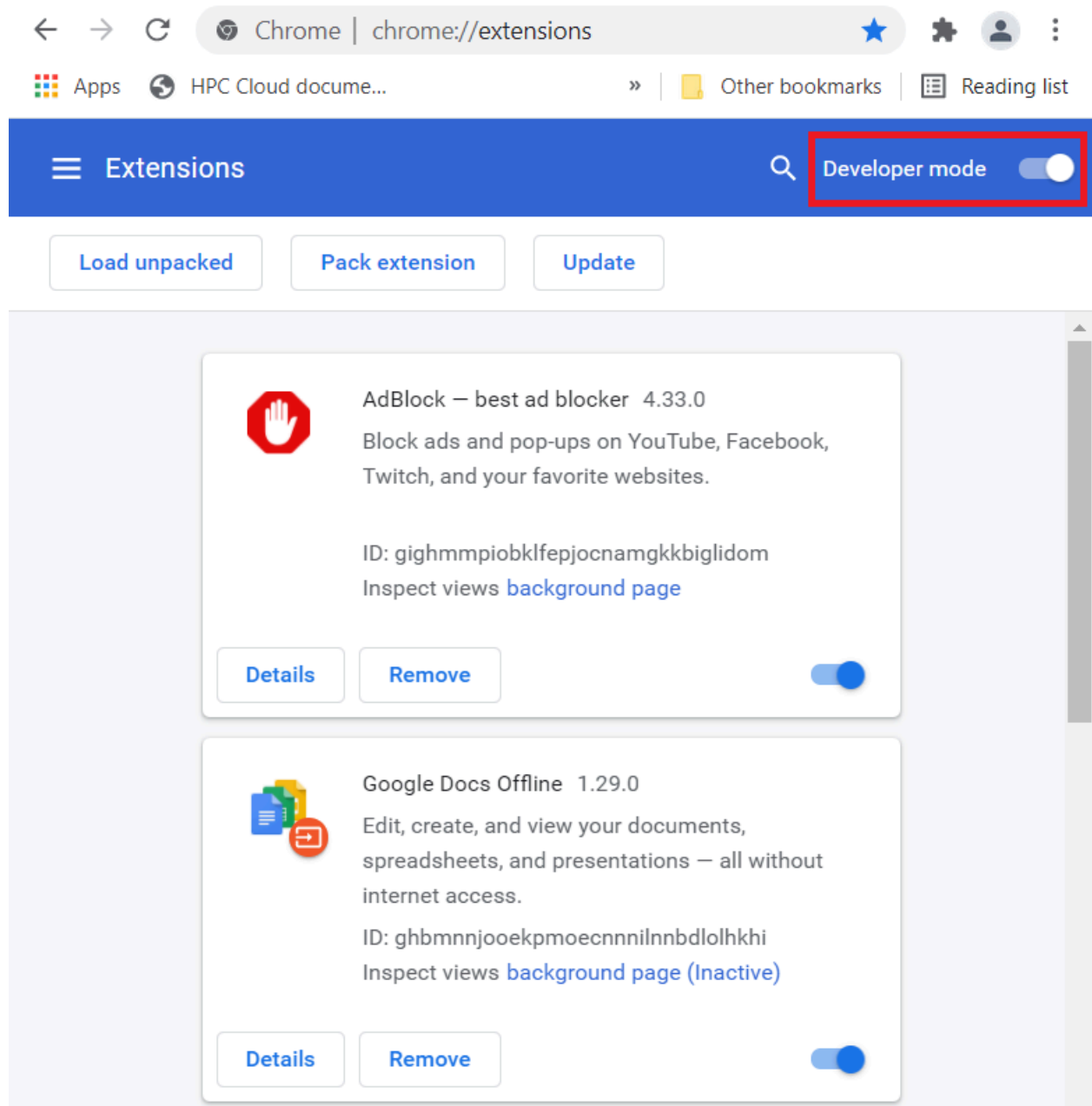
**Step 1:** extract the archive to any folder on your computer



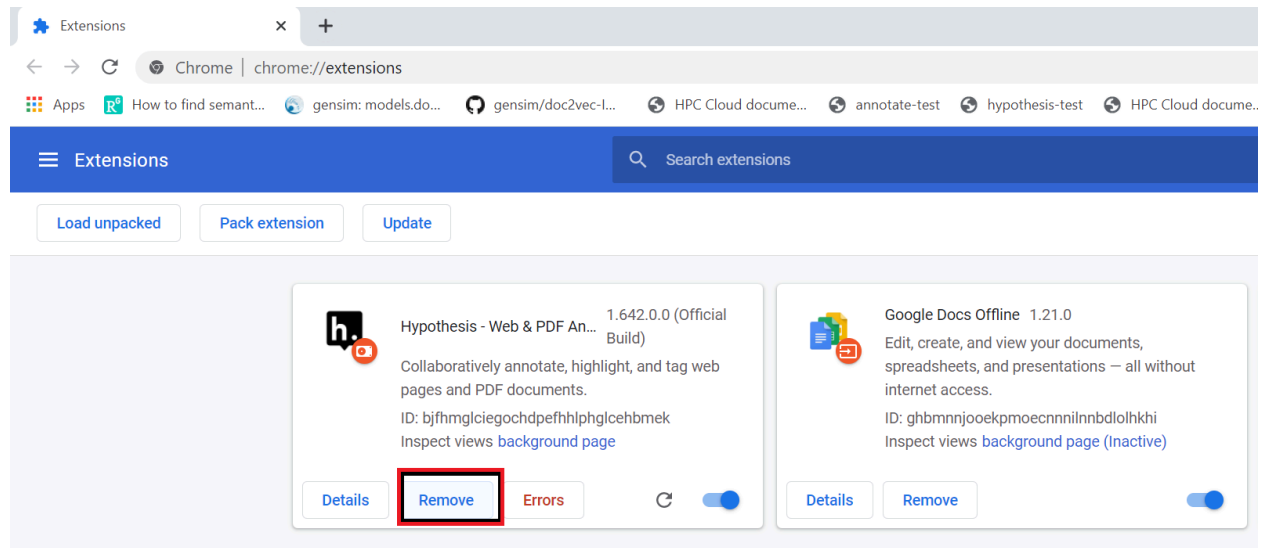
**Step 2:** Open Chrome  and navigate to the extensions tab (you can also do this by typing `chrome://extensions` in the address bar and hitting Enter). **NB:** you don't have to open Chrome in incognito mode like the image.



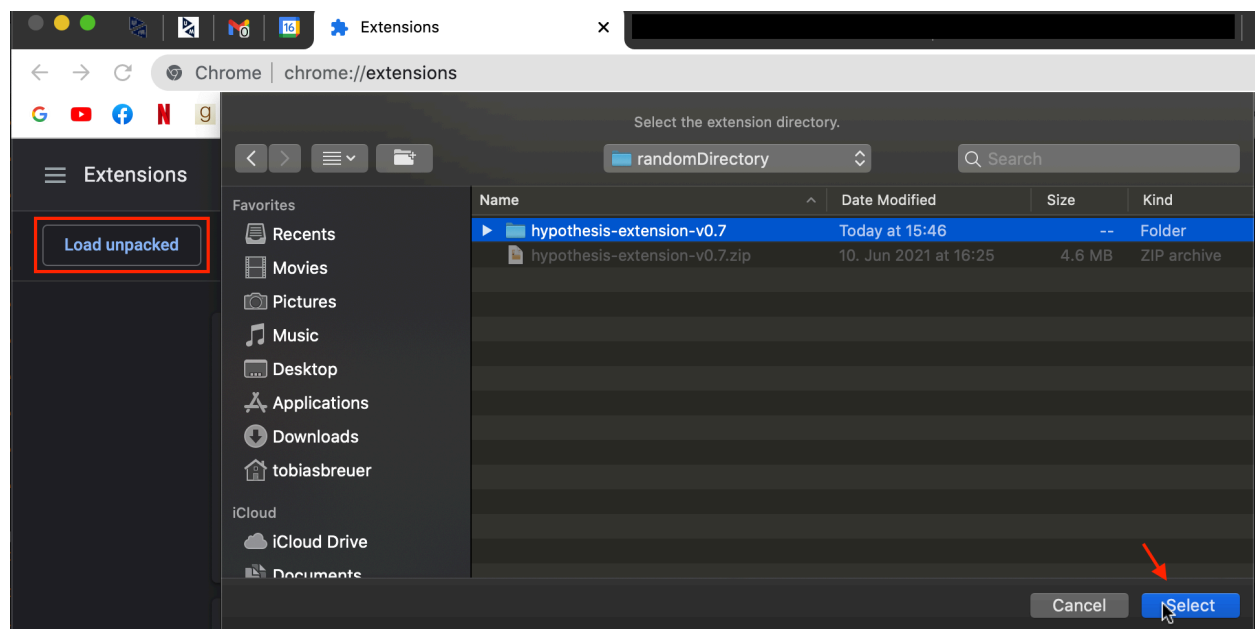
**Step 3:** Make sure “Developer mode” is enabled. If not, click the toggle switch as shown in the screenshot below to enable it.



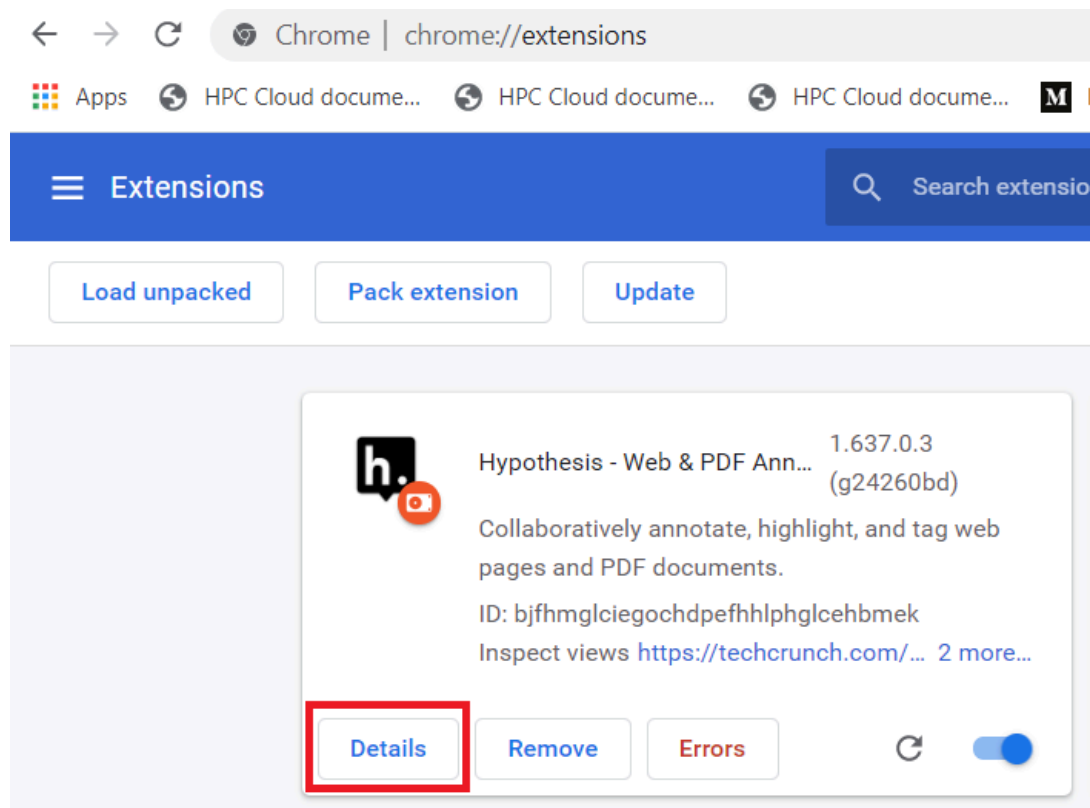
**Step 4:** If you already have the **default** version of Hypothes.is installed, remove it by clicking the “Remove” button as shown in the below image:



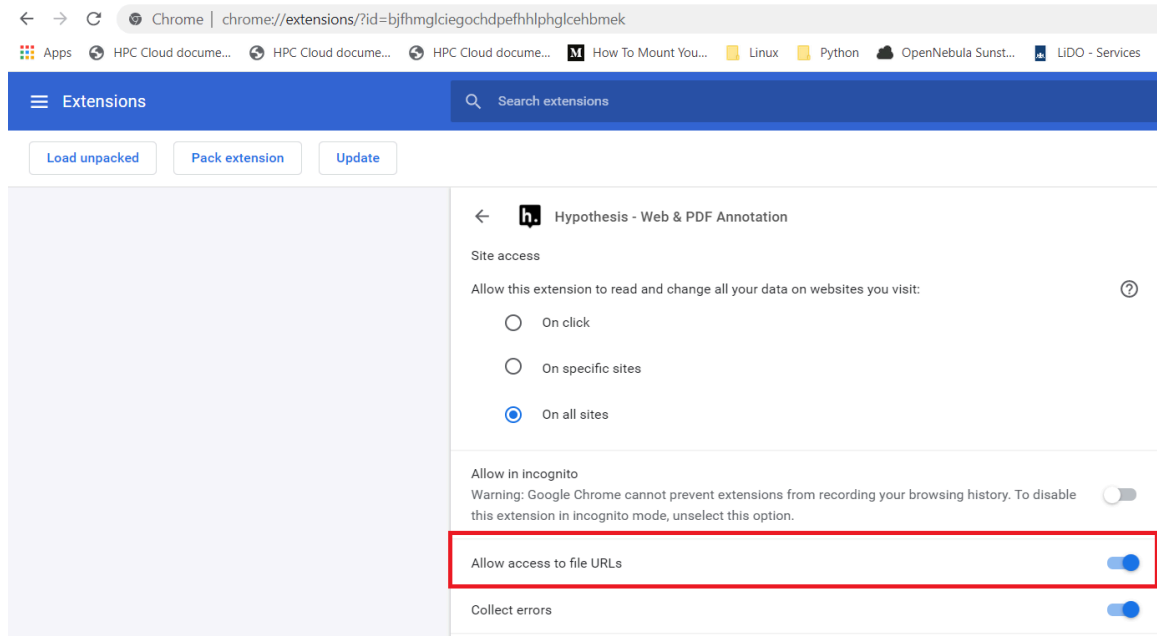
**Step 5:** Click on “Load unpacked” and navigate to the folder where you extracted our Hypothes.is Custom Tags extension (the contents of the file “Hypothesis-extension-v0.x.zip”). Click on “Select”.



**Step 6:** Click on “Details” in the Hypothes.is extension panel in your Chrome extensions tab. See image below:



In the new page that appears, enable the “Allow access to file URLs” option (you may need to scroll down to see this option). See image below:



Step 6 will ensure that you allow the Hypothes.is extension access to files (e.g. PDF files) to annotate.

After performing these steps you will have Hypothes.is installed in your Chrome browser! Make sure to login to the plugin at the top right of the screen (create a Hypothes.is account if you don't have one).
