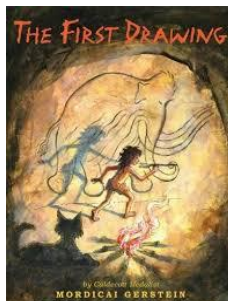

1. Watch Lesson Intro (instruction/demo/examples) & Read Aloud (arts literature connection)

3. Collect supplies around the house for use in your time machine.
Some ideas: boxes, wrapping paper, lids, toilet paper rolls, ribbons, stickers, paints, etc.

4. Make a plan in your mind, or on a piece of paper of how you would like your time machine to look and work. Think about what time periods you would like to visit.
