Preceptorship is similar to internships completed by doctors of medicine, dentists, and other healthcare professionals.

- Prior to preceptorship, chiropractic students have already completed at least 12 of the 14 terms of education and clinicals. A licensed NC Doctor of Chiropractic will act as a mentor to the intern, helping to bridge the gap between the classroom, the college clinic, and private practice.
- By not allowing chiropractic students to complete their preceptorship in North Carolina, our state is missing out on the opportunity to showcase itself as a great place to live and work. This puts NC at a competitive disadvantage for new business growth and job creation for the state.
- Support of this bill helps increase the number of Doctors of Chiropractic in our state, enabling us to better serve the growing population and provide more access to drug-free pain options.
